# Visit to the Camp:

On March 29th, I was able to go to the camp in Waycross and meet with Mike and get a good start on camp issues for this summer.

# Horse program:

I was finally able to get in touch with Hillary who is in charge of the horse program. I shared some ideas with her on what we can do to make the program more challenging and offer some educational ideas on the side. We are both excited about the opportunities.

### Job Announcement:

I had sent the councilor job announcement to Augusta University, Georgia Southern, and Georgia State PT, OT, and KT programs. I also sent them to the Blind rehab Programs at Western Michigan University, Florida State, Northern IL and Boston University.

### Local Lions Club:

I visited my local Lions Club on Friday, April 5 as the guest speaker and picked up an application to join the National Hills club. After speaking with them, they agreed to help sponsor one of four campers in our area that wishes to come to the camp. The National Hills Club may also sponsor another one as time gets closer. The president was going to see if the other Lions Clubs will pitch in to help sponsor the other three campers in the Augusta area.

### Schedule:

I am continuing to work on the various events at what time for each week of camp. For the adult camp weeks, I have a water park, bowling, tandem cycling, and an advance horseback riding program as the major events. We will still be swimming, wall climbing and all sorts of games and other challenges to fill in the rest of the schedule.

During Family camp week, I have three professionals coming in the area of Orientation and Mobility, Certified Vision Rehab Therapist, a TVI from the state of Georgia and a Technology specialist in the area of Adaptive Technology. I am also looking at bringing in a jumping balloon rides, a petting zoo and treasure hunt with prizes for the young kids.
