BURNING ON YOUR OWN PROPERTY

If you plan to do yard waste burning on your property you **must** get a burn permit beforehand from Benton County. (If you don't and a fire truck comes out because someone reports smoke at your property, you will be charged for the fire service call.) Call **Benton County at 1-866-207-5140.** Burn Ban info can be found on our website: www.lbvca.com. (**Burning of construction materials is prohibited.**) *Do not leave smoldering fires unattended!*

CLEANING UP YOUR PROPERTY:

Please remember: Be a good neighbor and rake out leaves and tree debris from your ditches and culverts to prevent water run-off problems, and either burn them or haul them away. If you hire someone to rake leaves or clear other yard waste from your property be sure to tell them to NOT push it into a ditch or culvert or into the street. The property owner can bring them to the Village collection site on West Airport or take it to Inland Waste Service (479-878-1384) for disposal. You will be charged a clean-up fee if LBVCA has to clean out your ditch.

INJURED OR DEAD ANIMALS: To report an injured or dead animal (deer, raccoon, etc.) and have it removed from a <u>state</u> culvert or <u>state</u> road, contact the **Arkansas Game & Fish Department** at 1-866-253-2506. (They'll need the street address of where the animal is located.) If you find a dead animal or deer parts on your property (left behind by hunters or coyotes), you may bury them but <u>NOT</u> burn them (according to the AR Dept. of Environmental Quality).

The Benton County Roads Dept. and Sheriff's Dept. state they have no program in place for picking up dead deer from county roads or culverts. If the animal is lying in a culvert, notify the AR Dept of Environmental Quality at 1-888-233-0326.

VILLAGE ROADS:

Green and **Blue** street signs in the village are county roads. If you live on a road with potholes or ruts, **call Benton County Roads (479-271-1052)** to have it repaired. You do not need to call the Village Office or wait for a Board meeting to report it.

SPEED LIMIT & PARKING in LBV: The speed limit throughout the Village is **20 or 25mph** and is enforceable by the Benton County Sheriff's dept. *There is* **no onstreet parking** throughout LBV.

Did you know?

- ⇒ Trash containers are to be removed off street/curb same day after scheduled pickup. As per our covenants Art IX, Sec 3, the trash/garbage cans shall be concealed from view from all public right of ways.
- ⇒ Definition of an SAU as per our covenants: Art VI, Sec 3:

"In Class C, members may combine contiguous lots, up to five (5) acres in total area and designate them as one property with one (1) annual maintenance assessment or, when applicable, special assessment. Lots across a platted street or road from each other are not considered contiguous. Contiguous lots so combined shall herein be referred to as a "Single Assessment Unit". Only those Single Assessment Units in place one year or more before they are served by a public water and sewer system shall continue as a Single Assessment Unit.

To designate multiple lots as a Single Assessment Unit, the Record Owner of multiple lots must submit to the Community Association an affidavit certifying that all of the following conditions are met:

The lots 1) are contiguous; 2) are held under common ownership and show proof of such ownership by attaching copy of the deed(s) which are recorded in the Benton County Records; 3) consist of five (5) acres or less in total area; and 4) are limited to one improved lot."

Airport Safety First!

- ONLY AUTHORIZED VEHICLES (EMERGENCY AND MAINTENANCE) ARE ALLOWED ON RUNWAY.
- THE RUNWAY IS ALWAYS ACTIVE. Airplanes typically land with engines throttled back...you may not hear a plane that is landing, especially if you are wearing ear buds.
- AIRPORT MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT could be operating on or about the runway. Be alert.
- WALKING, JOGGING, BICYCLING, PLAYING ON THE RUNWAY MAY BE DANGEROUS

I do not have to remind you about what you already know. The weather is unpredictable, and the roads can be dangerous if you are not careful. If the weather threatens snow, ice and all that nasty stuff, don't drive if it is at all possible to stay home. As good of a job as our snowplow and salt/sander can do, the roads are difficult to navigate when the seasons change. Be it wet leaves or light snow, please drive carefully.

If you are raking leaves and expect to burn them on your own property, be sure to call CENCOM 479-273-5530 or 866-207-5140 before burning. There may be a burn ban on.

Lastly, always be careful as you drive on Village roads, noting that the equipment operator may not see or hear you while he is operating the noisy equipment. Give them a width berth.

BUILDING NEWS

Architectural Control Committee

Another couple months of rainy weather, but that hasn't slowed down the construction. Not only did the Office Building deck project get finished, but the other residential building projects in Lost Bridge and Posy Mountain moved forward regardless.

Only one new application for a new home in Posy was submitted, but there were inquiries into more.

Recent discussion topics within the ACC meetings concerned lot line releases.

For those who are thinking of starting a construction project, or those in the throes of one and unsure what the next step is, see below:

The Guidelines/Procedures for Building Applications are as follow:

Property owner submits proposed building plan application to LBVCA ACC, whom reviews these plans for <u>Covenant Compliance</u>, and then approves/denies applications using Building Standards & Practices as a guide. Building Project Checklist is completed by property owner, and appropriate fees and performance deposits are collected.

Benton County Development (Building Safety Division) will only issue appropriate Building Permits **after** receiving application approval from LBVCA ACC.

After project is completed, ACC follows up and reviews/approves/denies for <u>Covenant Compliance</u>. When the CO (Certificate of Occupancy) is issued by a Benton County Building Inspector, and final approval is then obtained from the ACC, the property owner may then apply to the ACC for a refund of their Performance Deposit.

To stay updated or voice your opinions about building projects, please come join us at our next meeting! Monday February 3rd, 2020 at 9am at the Village office with a stupendous view of the lake and our new DECK.
