

A busy church is a growing church! I know I have said that very often, but this time of year it becomes apparent just how true it is! The busiest part of the church year is here. When you drive by a church or come see their Facebook or website, how do you know if that church is a growing church? There are many indicators, but the most obvious and observable is how active they are. When I say "growing" I'm not only referring to increasing worship attendance. A busy church often does grow in worship attendance. But a lack of increase in worship attendance does not mean the church isn't growing. A busy church grows also in faithfulness, in discipleship, in mission, in love and in relationship with the world, with each other and with God. I am asking all of you reading this to help this church get busy!

The Vincentown United Methodist Church is about to get very busy, and I am excited to tell you about all of the great ministry, mission and worship opportunities that you can get involved with this Fall. On Sunday, September 8th our normal Sunday morning schedule will resume. This includes Sunday School for all ages starting at 10:00. Every Sunday morning offers several different opportunities for prayer and study. Bev Adams will be leading her usual adult Sunday School class through powerful discussions, and Sue Mansfield and Peggy Thomas welcome you to come and pray with them before things begin. We also invite you to our 10:15 Prayer and Praise Time. This is an opportunity to get some more of the praise songs that you might like, you get a teaser from me about the week's sermon topic and you will get unique and transformative opportunities to pray in the pews or at the kneeling rail. Then we all gather in one place at one time for an 11:00 worship service with both traditional and contemporary elements of worship.

In addition to our returning Sunday morning schedule, many other things resume in September as well. The choir will be back and is ready to aid our worship with heavenly singing. Rehearsals are Wednesday nights at 7 and Peg Ryan is always happy to have more singers join the choir! Margo's Wednesday afternoon Leisuretowne Bible Study resumes on September 11th. We hope to see new faces and hear new voices for Bible study this year! Sue Olson and the Youth Group for ages 12+ are continuing to meet on Wednesday nights at 7pm and are excited about going to Ignite. And our Food Pantry is thriving with help from your very generous donations. We now expect to host over 30 families each month. Our Food Pantry is officially open the first Saturday of every month, but walk-ins are always accepted!

As you see, we are continuing all of the ministries that we had before. But I am extremely excited to announce a couple new offerings for you this Fall! First, we are starting a Methodism class for adults. Were you inspired by all of the things that our Confirmation Class learned and did? You're not alone! Several people from our congregation expressed an interest in learning about those same things. So, we are starting an adult Methodism class this Fall. Please let me know if you are interested. Once we know who wants to come, we will make a meeting schedule. Second, also as a result of the Confirmation Class, we have started a new Junior Youth Group for ages 7-13. They call themselves the Vincentown God Squad! After only one month of meetings, we have already had 11 different kids attend our Junior Youth Group. And we are always ready for more. Like a year-round VBS, this Junior Youth Group learns about the Bible, learns new songs and dances and then goes to an activity like science experiments, games, crafts and missions.

I want to officially invite you to join us and get involved in our church in any way this Fall. You can worship with us, join the choir, attend Bible Study, expand your Sunday morning prayer at Prayer and Praise Time, join Youth Group or Junior Youth Group or get involved in the Food Pantry. These are only a few of the many ways to get involved in the church's growth this Fall. We need you to help us keep growing. I pray that God's call in your life will become very clear.

Friends, won't you join me in prayer? I ask that you pray for the Vincentown United Methodist Church. I ask that you pray for the Church all over the world. I ask that you pray for our country. Vincentown Inspires Children to Grow in Faith One Project at a Time

everend David Ledford, III, pastor at Vincentown United Methodist Church, invites free expression in everything he does. "Christian learning that's fun equals a life transforming," he said in a recent interview.

Ledford and his church tucked in an historic, agrarian village within the Burlington County township of Southampton is committed to fostering a Christian education that is inclusive and makes learning both challenging and fun. Their original sanctuary built in 1853 still stands as does their strong sense of community and investment in learning.

Born out of a confirmation class started in December 2018, a new junior youth group for ages seven through 13 began in July 2019.

"Our students didn't want to lose the connection they built. We like to think of it as a VBS [Vacation Bible School] that never ends," said Ledford who has been the church's pastor for four years.

The New Jersey native originally from Bound Brook likes to instill connection. When the confirmation classes began last December, one of the first things the group did was build a covenant where no one was judged and where everyone felt comfortable expressing themselves.

From December 27 until June 9 the confirmation class met every Thursday night. Each class began with 30 minutes of worship in which the eight confirmation students (and many of their parents

who wanted to stay and learn as well) were taught about what each ingredient of a worship service is all about.

"We discussed many worship topics; traditional worship, contemporary worship, special worship services for holidays and UMC Special Sundays and the Sacraments," said Ledford. After each lesson the children had the opportunity to act it out themselves. The worship was followed by 30-minute lesson topics ranging from the Old and New Testaments to the church history, United Methodist history, United Methodist doctrine and polity and United Methodist theology and beliefs.


By the end of the confirmation class, the students were required to complete a ministry project that reflected their own talents as well as the needs of the church, the community and the world around them.

One student who was clearly paying attention was 11-year-old Kathrine, who has recently expressed an interest in becoming a pastor. Following the classes, Kathrine preached the Pentecost sermon on Confirmation Sunday.

All of this when put together taught our young disciples of Christ that church membership is more than church attendance, It requires action, it is social jus-

The other students also latched onto his passion to be good disciples as well. Jenny helps him lead sessions in Vacation Bible School; Hunter has used her artistic skills to create bookmarks for the pew Bibles; Ava is channeling her love of animals to start a food pantry for pets; Mark is collecting necessary personal items for the homeless; Emma is embracing the church's rich history by creating a "Pastor Wall" that will display the pictures of all of the pastors who have served this church; Angelica is helping to bolster the

Vincentown UMC also offers several bible studies programs, women's circles, a choir, men's group and a food pantry on the first Saturday of every month.

Ledford's passion for teaching inspired him to pursue and earn an associate degree in Teaching (Raritan Valley Commity College, 2008), a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education (Kean University, 2010) and a Master of Divinity from Drew Theological School (2014). Prior to coming to Vincentown, he served churches in Berkeley Heights, Warren and Phillipsburg.
