Returning home with the gold medal from the 52nd Quebec International Pee-Wee Hockey Tournament in Quebec City, Canada, was important to this group of immensely talented, fiercely driven, superbly coached and incredibly supported 11-and-12-year-old kids. Winning the title would have been the glistening cherry atop the sundae.

But when the pain of their 2-1 defeat at the hands of the Quebec Remparts in the championship game begins to wane, the true measure of what they have accomplished will come into focus for the young boys. The boys from Hershey will review HOW MANY games they won, the skill and passion they displayed, and the sportsmanship they exhibited. It is then when they'll realize that losing the title game is not how they'll be remembered. Rather, they'll be remembered for accomplishing something special by falling one goal short in a tournament against the finest teams in the world.

Against Quebec, a team from the AA division, Hershey played the Remparts even through two periods of play.

In the third period Hershey opened the scoring as Graham McPhee continued his superb offensive play by finding the back of the net, assisted by Alex Peterson and AJ Drobot to give Hershey a 1-0 lead. Quebec then tied the game 1-1 at the 10:34 mark. With only 28 seconds left in the game, Hershey on the PK, Quebec scored again to take a 2-1 lead. Needing more attackers in an attempt to tie the score, Hershey pulled its goaltender, Alex Flocken, who was named the tournament MVP for his superb play through 13 contests. The Junior Bears got off a nice shot on net with time winding down that many believed crossed the goal line with eight seconds left, but the referees ruled no goal in the final flurry and the game was over.

The Hershey Jr. Bears 2011 tournament team left us all with many special memories as the boys from Chocolatetown put on quite a show. Hats off to the following fine young men:

Tournament Game 5 (SEMI FINAL) - Hershey 5 Basses Laurentides 1

Sunday, February 20, 2011 @ 8:30AM - Pepsi Colisee`

I just walked out of a semi-final hockey game at the 52nd annual Québec International Pee-Wee AA Hockey Tournament at the Pepsi Colisée with the chants of *Hershey, Hershey, Hershey* ringing in my head following a Hershey 5-1 victory in a semi-final matchup against Basses Laurentides Ouest Conquérants from the AA-Légaré division. When I got back to my hotel room, I strolled into the room – closed the door behind me, rose my arms in the air and quietly repeated the words, "yes, yes, yes". Can you see a theme developing here?

The journey started 10 months ago on one April evening as over 100 boys from the surrounding area appeared at the Giant Center to try out for the 2011 Hershey

Québec team. Head coach Doug Yingst and his staff wasn't looking for the best players, simply the right ones. And the right ones he got, as 21 bright eyed and eager hockey players from Chocolatetown Pennsylvania once again find themselves in the finals only 1 win away from the three peat.

The game began as many of them have in the past, with Hershey coming out hard and fast to set the tone in the game. The forward line of Wine, Drobot and Seyfert would not be denied as they combined for 3 goals and 5 assists. Stefan Krupski pitched in with some outstanding play from the back end chipping in 2 assists.

The teams went through almost an entire opening period of play, seeing who would flinch first. As it turned out, Hershey Captain AJ Drobot would not let it be his boys, as Drobot scored with 3 tenths of a second remaining in the 1st assisted by Seyfert and Wine to put Hershey up 1-0.

The 2nd period is when Hershey delivered the knockout punch. Graham McPhee scored what turned out to be the game winner, 5:54 into the period to give Hershey a 2-0 lead. It wasn't 30 seconds later when Jordan Seyfert delivered a nice shot from the slot off of a sweet pass from Krupski to increase the score to 3-0.

Basses Laurentides Ouest Conquérants got on the board less than 2 minutes into the 3rd to cut the Hershey lead top 3-1. Hershey continued their up tempo style of play as Seyfert got his 2nd goal of the game midway through the 3rd set up by tape to tape passing from Drobot and Wine to restore the 3 goal lead for a score of 4-1. With 7 seconds remaining in the period, Jonathan Coffey buried a shot from down low off assisted by Tyler Gratton and Ethan Clark.

The fans at the Pepsi Colisée saw first hand how Hershey plays hockey. Simple answer people, play as a team. That has truly been the story line here in Québec as Hershey displayed excellence from the defensive duos of Gratton / Krupski, Maniscalco / King and Clark / Parody. They gave the opponent little space through 3 periods of play. The offensive mates of McPhee, Peterson, Coffey and Keth, Hallman, Field and Kahlua, Gratton generated some point black scoring chances to keep the Conquérants on their heels for the majority of the game in a fine 5-1 victory.

Alex Flocken held down the fort for all 3 periods, making stellar save after stellar save as Colin Cain and Kevin Dorozinsky watched and cheered on their boys through 37 minutes of play.

Hershey plays its final tournament game Sunday afternoon at 4:00 p.m. in a finals matchup against the Québec Remparts, champions of the AA-Légaré division, at the Pepsi Colisée in a AA finals contest.

Tournament Game 4 - Hershey 6 Québec Nordiques 3

Saturday, February 19, 2011 @ 7:15PM - Pepsi Colisee`

With the tension mounting as the competition improves, the Hershey Jr. Bears squared off with the Québec Nordiques for their 4th tournament game at the 52nd annual Québec International Pee-Wee AA Hockey Tournament. The NHL Québec Nordiques moved south to Denver Colorado in 1995, but their fans stayed behind. These fans were on display Saturday night in a packed arena to root for their home town Québec Nordiques Pee-Wee team. The boys from Hershey were not intimidated by the thousands on hand as they skated to a 6-3 victory.

The game began as Hershey had to send its penalty kill unit of Kahlau, Field, Maniscalco, and King to the ice just 26 seconds in. No worries, as the penalty killers and the Hershey goaltending was again up for the challenge. After sound 4 man play the PK unit of Hallman, Keth, Cain and Parody took the ice to close out the remainder of the penalty, and close it out they did as Keth took a feed from Hallman and scored short handed to give Hershey a 1-0 lead and silence the home town faithful. Minutes later Hershey went on the power play and Maniscalco again showed his offensive flare by sneaking in the back door and firing a shot past the Nordique goaltender, assisted by Seyfert and Gratton, to increase the lead 2-0. Later in the period, the offensive mates of McPhee, Peterson and Coffey dazzled the crowd as McPhee appeared to score Hershey's 3rd goal of the contest as the

puck went in the top corner of the net, the red goal lamp lit up, only to be waved off by the referee. I guess he saw something the rest of us did not. With a 1:30 to go in the period, Québec managed to get on the board to tighten the score 2-1.

The 2nd period began with Québec tying the game at 2 off of a nice shot as the crowd got back into the game. Both teams exchanged penalties and Québec scored again, this time 4 on 4 to take the lead by 1. The crowd is now backing the boys in baby blue as they believe their on there way to a "W". Not so fast, says the boys from Hershey. 34 seconds after Québec scored 4 on 4, Graham McPhee matched a 4 on 4 tally of his own off of a nice pass from AJ Drobot to even things at 3. As the period draws to a close, the game tied at 3, AJ Drobot took a nice pass from Parker Wine that put Hershey up for good.

The final period was much of the same, as Hersey extended its lead when AJ Drobot scored Hershey's 2nd short handed goal of the game to go up 5-3. The only chance Québec had left was to pull their goalie as the clock was ticking, which they did with just over 2 minutes to play. The Bears got the message as Wine scored his 7th goal of the tournament to send Hershey onto the semi-finals with a 6-3 Bears win.

Alex Flocken again saw the action through all 3 periods with his buddies of Colin Cain and Kevin Dorozinsky providing cheers and support throughout the contest. The forwards of Tyler Gratton and Tanner Kahlau along with the defensive pairing of Clark and Parody again had another strong game as they keep outworking, out hustling and out thinking the opposition as the boys from Hershey keep stacking up the wins.

Tournament Game 3 - Hershey 4 Lakeshore Panthers 1

The Hershey Jr. Bears took on the Lakeshore Panthers Saturday morning marking their 3rd tournament game at the 52nd annual Quebec International Pee-Wee AA Hockey Tournament in a contest that was very evenly matched. As the game ended, I'm certain that the Lakeshore coaching staff never wants to run into Alex Flocken again, as Flocken flat out robbed the Panthers offense, in a display worthy of 5-10, to lead the Hershey Jr. Bears to a 4-1 victory.

The 1st period saw Hershey send its power play unit out off of a Lakeshore penalty 2 minutes in as the Hershey PP unit of Drobot, Wine, Seyfert, Krupski and Gratton display remarkable offensive zone pressure as they generated quality scoring chances only to be denied by the lakeshore back stop. A few moments late, Lakeshore was able to sneak behind the Hershey defenders, but Flocken was up to the task by flashing the leather to make a nice glove save to keep the game scoreless. Hershey had to send its penalty kill unit on the ice to face their 1st PK of the game. The 2nd period had both teams exchanging punches, as Hershey was able to get on the board on a blast from the point by Chris Gratton, assisted by Krupski and McPhee. The 5 man units of Wine, Drobot, Seyfert, Gratton, Krupski and McPhee, Peterson, Coffey, Maniscalco, King were able to figure out the Lakeshore attack as they began to apply their own offensive zone pressure by controlling the neutral zone area of the ice. End of 2nd Period Hershey 1 / Lakeshore 1

The final period thus far, seems to be the period where Hershey puts the hammer down. This game was no different. At the beginning of the period, Flocken made another brilliant save on a Lakeshore breakaway and Hershey was off and running. Sam Field took a pass from Mason Keth, following a tremendous defensive zone effort from Blake Hallman on the play, as Field buried the shot short side to put Hershey up 2-1. The defensive pairings of Gratton / Krupski, Maniscalco / King and Clark / Parody again were to much for the Lakeshore attack as they rose to the occasion when needed most. With time winding down and Lakeshore trailing 2-1, they pulled there goalie to get on an extra attacker. Thank you very much, said they Bears as Chris Gratton fired a shot off of a McPhee pass that found the back of the net for a 3-1 lead. AJ Drobot scored his 13th of the tournament on assists by Seyfert and Wine as time expired to give Hershey a 4-1 hard fought victory.

Alex Flocken again saw the action through all 3 periods with his net minding mates of Colin Cain and Kevin Dorozinsky cheering on mates to victory. Tyler Gratton and Tanner Kahlau continued to play at a fast pace as they are quick on the attack to help their team from Hershey advance.

The race for the 52nd annual Quebec International Pee-Wee AA Hockey Tournament championship is heating up as we've passed the quarter mark and teams are heading for the home stretch as the competition is tightening up.

Some questions arose following a Friday night contest that produced a few surprises following a 4-1 Bears victory: Why is it raining in Quebec City in February? As much as I try, I still can't seem to memorize that Pee-Wee song, any ideas people? Does Bruce Clark really have the lung capacity of an Opera singer? Was it the overwhelming fanfare, the soft ice or the Rimouski Oceanic defensive scheme that slowed down the Hershey Jr. Bears offensive attack? And finally, has anybody figured out how to keep Andy Reid from that plate of cheeseburgers?

After an impressive 9 game stretch that delivered over 6 goals per game average, the high flying Hershey Jr. Bears were held to 4 in a hard fought 4-1 victory over Rimouski Océanic (Mont-Joli) at the Pepsi Colisée in another team effort that saw contributions from all.

Hershey opened the scoring as Tyler Gratton (or Grattòòòòòòòòò) as we say here in Quebec, scored his 4th of the tournament on a nice feed from Blake Hallman. The remainder of the period saw some back and forth action by both teams to end the period with Hershey protecting a 1-0 lead.

The 2nd period saw AJ Drobot start off by taking matters into his own hands 4 minutes in by scoring to give the Bears a 2-0 lead off of more of his offensive creativity as he exploded down the wing and fired a bullet that found the back of the net assisted by Chris Gratton. Actually in this instance, it was a cannon that we saw being unleashed past the Rimouski net minder. Several minutes later, Rimouski Océanic got on the board on an awkward bounce off of the end glass as Hershey was trying to send the puck around the boards, as the puck deflected out in front as Rimouski Océanic was able to bang it home to cut Hershey's lead to 2-1. Following the goal, Hershey had to send its penalty kill unit on the ice to face their 2nd PK of the game. The unit of Hallman, Keth, Krupski and Gratton would give nothing as they were able to thwart any thoughts of Rimouski pressure to keep the 1 goal lead intact

The 3rd period began as Rimouski was determined to get back in the contest; however the defensive pair of Parody and Clark would not comply. Clark made a dazzling move at the offensive blue line to eliminate any notion of an odd man rush by the opposition protecting a 2-1 lead. Minutes later, Graham McPhee drove hard through the middle of the ice and fired a shot on net as Alex Peterson banged home the rebound to score as the Jr. Bears took a 3-1 lead. Following the celebration - 9 seconds later, McPhee was at it again. Taking a pass from Jonathan Coffey, McPhee went flying down the wing and again took it straight to the net to give the Bears a 4-1 lead. The game ended as our PK unit of Kahlau, Field, Clark and Parody sealed the victory.

Alex Flocken again saw the action through all 3 periods making multiple key saves to stifle the Rimouski Océanic squad. Yes folks, when the Jr. Bears offensive machine isn't firing on all cylinders, the defensive tandems of Krupski / Gratton, King / Maniscalco, Clark / Parody are more than up to the task. They along with Flocken who played superbly through 3 would not be denied. Flocken made a nice diving play on a loose puck in the 1st period to keep the score at 0's as his mates of Tim Hoarty, Colin Cain and Kevin Dorozinsky cheered on every great play.

The offensive units of Wine, Drobot, Seyfert, and Keth, Hallman, Field kept their stellar play in action as they played a phenomenal all around game to help their boys from Chocolatetown advance.

For the second time in as many exhibition games at the 52nd Quebec International Pee-Wee Hockey Tournament in Quebec City, Canada, the Jr Bears jumped out a 4-0 lead and cruised to victory, the latest in a 7-2 win over Austria on Friday at Rejean Lemelin Rink. For the second consecutive game, Hershey's defense played a major role in the victory. Early in the first period, goaltender and assistant captain Alex Flocken kept the game scoreless with

a sweet save of a point-blank shot from the slot. Then Ethan Clark turned in a nice defensive 1-on-1 denial in the defensive zone. The Hershey offense was quick to the puck while solid fore-checking by Jonathan Coffey and Graham McPhee controlled the neutral zone throughout the first 10 minutes. The boys from Chocolateown scored twice in the final 27 seconds of the period to take a 3-0 lead. Blake Hallman fed Mason Keth for a goal with 27 seconds left, and shortly after the face-off Tyler Gratton took a feed from Tim Hoarty and scored with six seconds left to play in the period. The Junior Bears again displayed some late-period lightning as the dynamic duo of Drobot and Wine once again worked their magic from behind the net to put another tally on the board for the chocolate and white. Hershey had a solid 5-0 lead. The tandems of Branson King and Josh Maniscalco worked the blue line to push the puck deep throughout the period, while the D-pairing of assistant captain Stefan Krupski and Chris Gratton remained unflappable. Alex Peterson chipped in with some sterling defensive play, breaking up a 2-on-1 rush by tracking back hard to get in the play and cut-off the puck carrier.

After Austria scored early to draw within 5-2, the Junior Bears answered right back, and Hershey continued to dominate play in the third period. After not being able to capitalize on an early power play opportunity, Hershey found the back of the net nearly six minutes in the third for a 6-1 lead. Tyler Gratton took a pass from Kahlau and scored his second goal of the game with a sweet toe drag around a defenseman to score from the slot.

With Austria on the power play with just over two minutes to play, the Junior Bears again leaned on their penalty kill unit of King, Maniscalco, Kahlau and Field along with fine network by Dorozinsky to keep Austria off the board.
