Ernie tells Rich the only way to beat that is with a sheephead. So that's what he did. Our last stop was calicos about every cast. I had a full limit. Jackpots went to Rich for his sheephead and me for a 4 pound calico.

Bass, whitefish, sheephead, lizardfish. I fished the plastics up front catching calicos while the rest were content dropper looping. I refrained from drinking while the others continued to party. 35 on the boat and many tangles I just stayed out of the way but it was fun to be out there.

Trip#2 was my annual Lake Crowley trout slaughter fest with former member Rich P. We get there Sunday the 21st. in the a.m. and launch my boat. Knowing the lake so well and the patterns of the fish, we scope out the situation heading to the north end first. The water was 50 degrees and dirty. We drug our streamers behind the boat with full sink fly line, and 8 ft. leaders. The fish didn't want to bite so we went back to the west side Hilton Bay area. The water was clean and running 55 to 57 degrees, perfect!! In a nutshell, we caught and released 31 nice chunky trout that day. The nite went by bringing a storm with it. We woke up with snow wind and light rain. We said what the hell, we're here let's drive down to the lake and see what it looks like. The guy at the entry gate looked at us as if we were crazy , having a small boat and it was also foggy. We launched anyway, stayed by the wind protected cliffs and picked off two trout trolling those cultivas. Those are great lures. The wind subsided but the light snow and rain stayed with us most of the day. The wind came up around 3:00p.m. not before catching 30 more rainbows and browns for the day. Not bad, 61 fish in two days. Our biggest was about 3lbs. We saw one other boat that mourning , but he left. We were the only ones on the lake that day, leaving, the tackle shop was closed and the entry gate personal had left.

A Recipe From Rich Jenkins

Yellowtail Bake

Ingredients:

4 pieces of Yellowtail (Remove all dark spots)
1 cup of each of the following items:
Diced Red or White Onion
Diced Green Cabbage
Diced Green Bell Pepper
Diced Red Bell Pepper
Diced Cilantro (Reserve some)
Your favorite Jelly

2- Diced Jalapeños
1-Lime (Zest and Juice)
4-Pads of Butter
Salt and Pepper to Taste
Non stick spray

Preparation:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Dice all vegetables and mix up in large bowl. Spray 8x10 glass oven dish with non stick spray. Place vegetables in glass dish and evenly space Yellowtail on top. Place pads of butter, reserved cilantro, zest and juice of lime and Salt/Pepper on top of each piece of fish. Cover glass dish with aluminum foil and bake for 35 minutes at 350 degrees. After the 35 minutes, remove the foil and spoon on any Jelly of your choice and broil on high for 5 minutes.

Remove from oven and enjoy!
