Pastoral Reflection

In this third installment of our parish reflection on Catholic Social Teaching, we turn to the New Testament, specifically the Gospels. The call to justice, mercy and compassion we witnessed in the Old Testament is intensely reflected in the New, especially in the ministry of Jesus. While there are many instances of concern for the poor and God's justice in the letters of Paul and the other letter writers of the New Testament, this reflection will just focus on two passages: Luke 4 and Matthew 25.

In Luke 4, Jesus begins his ministry by visiting the synagogue in Nazareth. Like some of you at Mass, Jesus was the reader for that ceremony and read from the book of the prophet Isaiah. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" (4:18-19). The prophetic voice of Isaiah reminded the listeners of God's concern for the liberation and relief of the poor and oppressed. The next line is important: "Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, 'Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing'" (4:20-21). At first, they received this well until Jesus reminded them that God often spoke through the poor, the widow, and the foreigner. This angered his listeners so much that they were prepared to throw him off a cliff to his death. This passage reminds us that CST is deeply rooted in the life and ministry of Jesus and that God has a special concern for most vulnerable of society.

Matthew 25 is a little more direct. The relevant passage begins with verse 25 with Jesus describing the judgment of the nations with the Son of Man separating the sheep from the goats. The sheep are rewarded with eternal life because when Jesus was hungry and thirsty, they fed him. When he was a stranger, they welcomed him, when naked they clothed him, and when in prison, they visited him. He explains to them that every time they did this for the "least brothers" they did it for him. The goats are cursed to hell since they did not feed or clothe him; they did not welcome him, and did not visit him. They too receive the explanation that inasmuch as they failed to do it for "these least ones" they failed to do it for him (25:31-46). These words, clearly articulating the responsibility of Christians, would become the inspiration for countless saints who sought to continue the ministry of Jesus and whose work provides a living foundation for contemporary Catholic Social Teaching.

So today we sing out, “Blessed are the poor in spirit,” looking to the Lord to satisfy our every need.
