Middle School News

Grade 6

Science: We just finished going over the scientific method and will be doing some hands-on projects to practice it more. So, look out for pictures on the school's Facebook page.

Math: We took a quiz on prime factorization before Thanksgiving break and started with the greatest common factor. We should be having a quiz on that very soon!

Social Studies: Students have been learning about the geography, culture, and legacy of the civilizations of Ancient India.

Literature: Students have been reading The False Prince.

Religion: The students are finishing their study into the second creation account found in Scripture. They are learning about the nature of sin, and just how attractive it can be, while at the same time learning about its eternally damaging effects. More importantly, through this review they are coming to a better understanding of how merciful God is and how much He loves them.

Skills: The students are finishing up Unit 3 and preparing for their coming test. Once they master the material found in Unit 3, they will then take a look back at the previous units and touch up on their skills.

Grade 7

Science: We just finished learning about physical and chemical properties and changes of matter. We now will learn about different types of matter. We will be doing at least two hands-on activities, so please look for pictures on the school's Facebook page.

Math: We just started to learn about unit rates and unit prices. We will be having a quiz on those topics very soon. Next, we will be looking more into it. problem-solving.

Social Studies: Students have been looking at life in colonial America.

Literature: Their social studies have been reflected in reading The Witch of Blackbird Pond.

Religion: The class has successfully finished learning about the foundational principle of the Catholic Faith - the Blessed Trinity; and they are now set to move onto Chapter 4, where they will learn about God's covenant. Their primary concern in this next chapter will be learning how the 10 Commandments regulate and shape that covenant.

Skills: The students have finished their Unit 3 examination and are now preparing to reassess and review their previously studied units. Once they are fully prepared and have a full grasp of Units 1-3 as a whole, then they will take a cumulative exam on all of the vocabulary contained therein.

Grade 8

Science: We just finished learning about the different forms of energy. We will be learning about energy transformations. They will be building paper roller coasters to demonstrate these changes. So, please keep an eye out on the school's Facebook page.

Math: We just went over ordering ration numbers. Now the students are focusing on operation with rational numbers. They will be getting quizzes about every week on the sections we go over.

Social Studies: Students have been learning about the Civil War, Literature: they have been reading Little Women.

Religion: The class is building off their examination into the value of making good moral decisions and has been diligently studying and contemplating the Ten Commandments. They are learning how those same moral choices are framed and centered around the Ten Commandments. Additionally, they are coming to understand what a tremendous gift they truly are, and how they help us to remain free. Following, the evaluation of the Commandments the students will be diving into the road to perfection - The Beatitudes.

Skills: The students finished Unit 3; however, before proceeding to Unit 4 they will have to first display their mastery and comprehension of the vocabulary contained in the previous units. At this point they are now reviewing their previous units in order to prepare for a cumulative exam consisting of all the vocabulary words from Units 1-3.
