Depictions of St. Peter and St. Paul in Art

In religious art, Apostles and saints are often depicted with attributes that symbolize their lives and deaths.

St. Peter is often shown with keys, based on Matthew 16:19a in which Jesus says to Peter *"I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven"*.

St. Paul is often depicted with a sword to represent his martyrdom by be-heading (Rome, 67 AD). Additionally, the sword is sometimes used to symbolize the "sword of the Spirit" or the Word of God, which Paul frequently referenced in his writing. You may also see the sword paired with a book or scroll which represents his writings (the Epistles).

Building Healthy Families

Someone once said you know you are Lutheran if you feel guilty about not feeling guilty enough. That's only funny because it's true! It's easy for us to hold on to guilt, but the effects of doing so are detrimental to physical, emotional and spiritual wellness. Studies show that unresolved guilt and negative thinking increase the stress hormones cortisol and adrenaline. Too many stress hormones increase heart rate, blood pressure and inflammation throughout the body. Our relationships with others and God become distant when guilt separates us. Make sure all the doors are shut tightly and locked if you are one of the last people to leave the church.

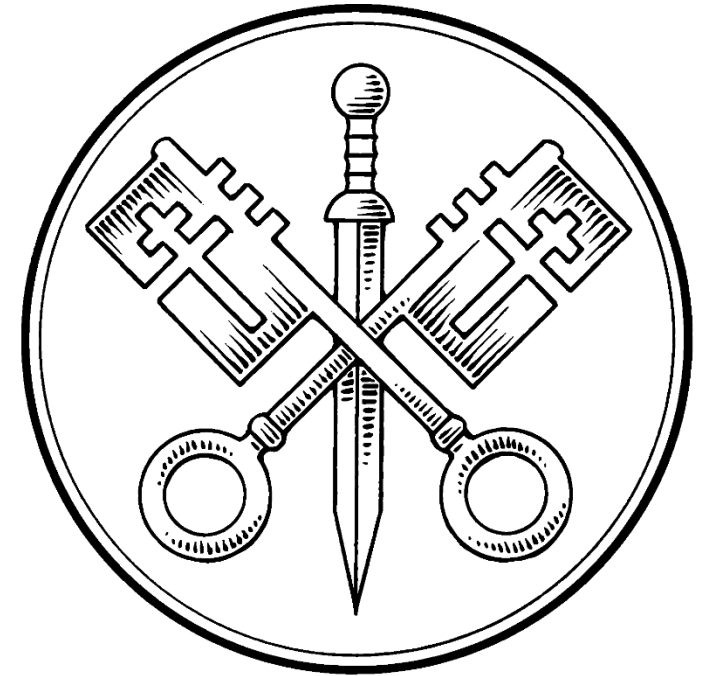
