## Tuesday April 30th

<u>Arrive Fort Beale RV Park Kingman, Arizona</u> Located at the heart of historic Route 66, Fort Beale RV Park is the most convenient stop for hundreds of miles! Just take

I-40 Exit 48 to Kingman, we are located less than a block East of the off ramp behind the Carl's Junior restaurant. Convenience, cleanliness and customer service are our top priorities. We also offer spotless restrooms, a 24-hour laundry facility, and a lovely pool. We recognize the need for easy on and easy off RV accommodations which is why 12 of our 42 big rig sites are wide/long pull throughs.

### Wednesday May 1<sup>st</sup>

8:30: Continental Breakfast in Club House (pastries, bagels, fruit cups, juice, coffee)

9:30: Caravan on "Old Route 66" to Oatman, AZ (28 miles) (A map and detailed driving instructions will be provided) Oatman is a village in the Black Mountains of Mohave County, Arizona, United States. Located at an elevation of 2,710 feet, it began as a small mining camp soon after two prospectors struck a \$10 million gold find in 1915, though the vicinity had already been settled for a number of years.

11:00 : A local historian will give a talk on the mines surrounding Oatman.

### Lunch on your own

1:30: Powerhouse & Arizona Route 66 Museum in Kingman (Tickets included in cost of Rally)
Located on the second floor of the Powerhouse Building, the historic museum opened in September 2001. This delightful collection has been a stopping point for thousands of visitors who arrive from around the world to travel on Route 66 for adventure and education.

Imaginative and ever-expanding displays present these modern-day explorers with a variety of information, including vehicles, photographs, and artifacts gathered over the history of



"The Mother Road." A one hour movie will be shown highlighting Route 66. We will then head downstairs to the Electric Car Museum, recently added, it includes a fascinating selection of electric vehicles such as race cars, motorcycles, and autos—both old and new.4:30: Happy Hour bring light snacks

## Thursday May 2<sup>nd</sup> - Break Camp and Move to Grand Canyon Caverns

8:30 : Continental Breakfast in Club House (pastries, bagels, fruit cups, coffee) 9:30 : Tour Mohave Museum of History and Art / Tour Bonelli House Museum (Tickets included in the cost of Rally) This tour is located a mile from the RV Park.

#### Lunch on your own

1:30: <u>Depart Kingman and drive Route 66 to the Grand Canyon Caverns RV park.</u>
An easy 64 mile drive (A map and detailed driving instructions will be provided)

The Grand Canyon Caverns is located along Route 66 in Northern Arizona. These are the largest dry caverns in the United States, located 200 to 300 feet below the surface, and accessible via our exploration elevator. Located in the middle of 3,000,000 acres of the most unspoiled land left in the world, we offer clean air, clear skies, open prairies, and a refreshing change of scenery from the urban world. We feature cavern tours that are easily accessible along paved walkways with handrails and for the more adventurous, off-path 'Explorers Tours'.

When we all camped in the 1950's and 1960's campgrounds always offered a nice picnic table and fire ring [weather permitting] with the gift of some space and privacy. That's what Grand Canyon Caverns RV park and campgrounds offers to today's outdoor enthusiasts. RV and camping guests have full use of their outdoor swimming pool, disc golf course and miles of nature trails right on our 800 acres. You'll enjoy a great stay on top of our amazing caverns which are right below you and accessible by elevator in the caverns building a short walk from your site.

4:30 : Happy Hour (no snacks)

5:00: Caravan to Seligman on Route 66. We have made reservations at the Road Kill Cafe & O.K. Saloon (this is a 26 mile drive to Seligman on Route 66) Dinner will be "on your own". The Roadkill Café, is an adventure in dining! Famous for its Char- broiled Burgers, Buffalo Burgers, and Steaks. The Roadkill Café OK Saloon is definitely well Worth the stop, along Route 66. Eating is more Fun when you

know it was hit on the run! Our menu has a great selection to choose from, and they are sure to have something for everyone!!! There's Great opportunity to take pictures and shop around for souvenirs in the Famous OK Saloon Gift shop. It is filled with all kinds of antiques from the area's "old west" past as well as many animals that are indigenous to the area. Located just outside is the old Arizona Territorial Jail whose walls once corralled such notorious outlaws as Seligman Slim, Four Fingered Frank and the legendary Carl "Curly" Bane. Standing next to the Jail is a replica of some old west store fronts that have been the background for many commercials and documentaries filmed in the area. Stop in and have a great time with us!! You kill it we grill it!!!

#### Friday May 3rd

8:30 : Continental Breakfast (outside, pastries, bagels, fruit cups, coffee)

9:30 : Caravan back to Hackberry General Store (35 miles back on route 66)



The Store opened in 1934 on the new alignment of Route 66 that was built on the north side of the railroad and bypassed the small town. It had a Conoco gasoline station and remained in operation until the Interstate bypassed this section of Route 66 in 1978. There is a lot to see when you visit the store.

There are many vintage cars outside it, from the "good old days" of the Mother Road. The place is full

of gadgets, signs, mementos, billboards and artifacts from the 1940s through the 1960s. It is a virtual journey through time to stop at the shop. The interior of the store has all kinds of Route 66 souvenirs so you can pick your choice.

The rest of the day will be spent exploring the caverns, mini golf, a walk back though time in the radiator springs museum and just relaxing in the great outdoors.

4:30 : Happy Hour bring light snacks

5:30: Cowboy dinner! We will have barbecues set up for you to grill your own meat. The hosts will provide, baked beans, garden salad, rolls. Join us around the campfire (weather permitting) for coffee/wine and cookies.

# Saturday May 4th - Break Camp and Head For Williams

8:30: Omelets in a bag! We will have all the fixings for you to combine and then we will cook your omelet in our pot. Hash brown potatoes, coffee and juice included.

11:00: <u>Break camp and head for Williams, Arizona</u> (70 miles, a map and detailed driving instructions will be provided) We have reserved pull through spaces at Railside RV Ranch. Established in 1994, Railside RV Ranch is the perfect hub for



your Grand Canyon and Northern Arizona experience. We are located adjacent to the tracks of the historic Grand Canyon Railway. Get your camera ready to photograph the vintage railroad, as it passes by the park on its way to the Grand Canyon.

The afternoon will be free to explore Bearizona, or downtown historic Williams and its Route 66 history.
