### BNC-PHOENIX UNIVERSITY ON WHEELS 2018

This year's University on Wheels features two Brandeis University faculty members whose experience and expertise presage an outstanding program. Our distinguished speakers, Professor Eileen McNamara and Assistant Professor Maura Jane Farrelly, will discuss the role of the media in today's political environment in their non-partisan presentation, *From Election to Investigation and All the "Fake News" in Between: Media Coverage of This Presidency*.

**Professor Eileen McNamara**, journalist and Pulitzer Prize-winning *Boston Globe* columnist, is chair of the Brandeis University Journalism Program and member of the American Studies Department. During her nearly 30 years at the *Globe* she covered everything from the night police beat to the United States Congress. She contributed to the *Globe's* coverage of the clergy sexual abuse scandal by recommending that the Spotlight Team look further into cases she had reported on previously. In addition to the Pulitzer Prize, she has been the recipient of multiple writing and public service awards, and has appeared on *The Today Show*, *Larry King Live*, *Nightline*, and *The Daily Show*. Her latest book, *Eunice*, *The Kennedy Who Changed the World*, a Simon and Schuster publication, will be released in April.

**Maura Jane Farrelly** Assistant Professor of American Studies and director of the Brandeis University Journalism Program, earned her PhD in history from Emory University. She worked as a full-time journalist for seven years, first for Georgia Public Radio in Atlanta and then for the *Voice of America* in Washington, D.C., and New York. Additionally, she did free-lance work for Public Radio International and the British Broadcasting Corporation. Professor Farrelly, is the author of *Papist Patriots: The Making of an American Catholic Identity*.

The residence for Harold and Mary located in Paradise Valley, was built as a winter home to entertain their six grandchildren when visiting from Oklahoma. It is the largest of all the Frank Lloyd Wright homes in Arizona. The home earned the nickname "The Grandma House" early on, as Mary Lou was instrumental in many of the home's features, working with Mr. Wright to find ingenious solutions for how the family would interact with each other, the home, and their desert surroundings. The home is exemplary in its use of common materials assembled in a most poetic manner, and is a crowning achievement in Mr. Wright's desire for man to live harmoniously with his environment. Joseph Cavanaugh, Ballet Master

Mr. Cavanaugh trained at the Virginia School of the Arts and the Royal Winnipeg Ballet School Professional Division. Since joining Ballet Arizona in 2001, Mr. Cavanaugh has performed featured, soloist and principal roles. His Balanchine repertoire includes principal roles in Agon, Serenade, Stravinsky Violin Concerto and Movements for Piano and Orchestra.

He helped create The Artist Relief Fund in 2013, which helps support the dancers of Ballet Arizona in times of extended injury, personal hardship, and imminent career transition. He also helps develop and implement educational and community programming for the ballet.



Ana Maria Spear, Dancer

Ms. Spear was born in Denver, Colorado and was raised in Payson, Arizona. She studied at White Mountain Academy of Dance, Grand Junction Academy of Dance, Arizona Youth Ballet and Scottsdale Ballet. She later finished her training at the School of Ballet Arizona. Ana Maria has performed in Balanchine's Walpurgisnacht, Western Symphony and Symphony in Three Movements. She has also danced in such classical ballets as La Bayadere, Paquita and Coppélia. She became a member of the company in 2016 and serves as treasurer of the Artist Relief Fund.



Ethan Price, Dancer

Mr. Price began dancing at the School of Ballet Arizona at age nine. He trained for eight years until he joined the School of Ballet Arizona Studio Company. Here he spent two years training and working with the main company in such ballets as: Don Quixote, Sleeping Beauty, La Bayadère, The Nutcracker, Swan Lake, Napoli and Coppélia. After his time in the studio company, he was accepted into the main company for the 2016/ 2017 season. This will be Ethan's second season with the company.



Lynne Haeseler, Pianist

Ms. Haeseler is a versatile artist who has performed nationally and internationally as a soloist, accompanist and dance pianist. Although trained as a classical concert pianist, Lynne has explored other collaborative and unconventional settings for piano performances. Influenced by dance theater, she expanded the notion of the piano recital into an integrated art performance. She has served on staff as dance pianist for Ballet Arizona Company and School, Arizona State University Dance Department and the Vail International Dance Festival.



### **Brandeis Happenings**

Brandeis University Biology professor Michael Rosbash is one of the winners of the 2017 Nobel Prize for Medicine.

Western society suffers chronic sleep deprivation, Jewish Nobel winner says American neuroscientist Michael Rosbash won medicine prize for research on circadian rhythms, increasingly seen as having significant effects on our health

A Jewish American neuroscientist who won the Nobel Prize for Medicine has said Western society suffers from a permanent case of sleep deprivation.

"It's been overlooked for a long time as a real public health problem," Michael Rosbash of Brandeis University told the *Guardian*, days after being awarded the prize, along with two other Americans for their research into the genes that control the body's circadian rhythms.

"All of Western society is a little bit sleep-deprived and, when I say a little bit, I mean chronically."

Researchers believe modern, electrically-lit life has profound effects on our bodies, as artificial lighting, shift work and frequent travel between time zones wreaks havoc on our systems' programming.

Rosbash, 74, along with Jeffrey Hall of the University of Maine and Michael Young of Rockefeller University in New York, used fruit flies to isolate a gene that controls the rhythm of a living organism's daily life. The biological inner clocks regulate functions such as sleep, behavior, hormone levels and body temperature.

"Virtually everything in our body, from the secretion of hormones, to the preparation of digestive enzymes in the gut, to changes in blood pressure, are influenced in major ways by knowing what time of day these things will be needed," Clifford Saper, professor of neuroscience at Harvard Medical School, explained to the newspaper.

Scientists believe disruptions to these inner clocks can be major contributors to the development of diabetes, heart disease, dementia and cancer.

Rosbash came to Brandeis in 1974 and is the Peter Gruber Endowed Chair in Neuroscience and professor of biology at the Jewish-founded nonsectarian school.

His parents were immigrants who fled Germany in 1938. His father was a cantor at Temple Ohabei Shalom, a Reform synagogue in Brookline, Massachusetts, not far from the Brandeis campus.







