Grays Harbor District Report

Arrivals YTD February 28, 2019 were 5 for a total of 13 jobs. Capt. White had duty in January and February. Capt. D'Angelo was released for duty on February 9th to cover jobs when Capt. White was sick. Capt. D'Angelo also covered the duty watch Feb. 16, 17, 27 & 28th for Capt. White. Capt. D'Angelo will have duty in March, April and May providing Capt. White an additional respite month after a very long duty watch. We anticipate 9 arrivals in March 2019.

Pilot Boat Replacement Project

The replacement committee will be meeting with representatives from the three manufacturers identified in the report between Monday and Wednesday. The goal of those meetings is to determine whether to work further with any or all of the firms, and if so to provide enough information to get a proposal on a specific boat to consider. Kahai has been doing some research with other associations that have replaced boats and has found a consultant that is highly qualified and been very helpful to those searches. We are going to connect him into our process after the meetings because of his experience and documented success in previous searches. Unfortunately we didn't find this contact earlier but believe he will be able to help us make the best decision as efficiently as possible.

Marina Dredging

Vladimir Shepsis has provided the final plans and specifications to include in a bid package. Staff is reviewing these for a final update. Our permitting consultant is working with the agencies to clarify and update the final information needed so we can move forward on time. We anticipate bringing the project to the commissioners at the April meeting to request authorization to advertise for bids.

Port, Corps and Community celebrate **Deeper Draft completion**



U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Seattle District Commander and District Engineer, Colonel Mark A. Geraldi and his staff were in attendance at the 6th Annual Port of Grays Harbor Business Report to help celebrate the completion of Deeper Draft.

After two years of dredging, the deepening of the Grays Harbor Navigation Channel to its congressionally authorized depth is now complete. Community and business leaders, along with Port customers, tenants and partners including Colonel Mark A. Geraldi and leadership from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Seattle District, came together in February to celebrate the second and final phase of Deeper Draft.

Phase II of Deeper Draft included dredging the channel from -36 feet MLLW to -38 feet MLLW. The project was officially completed by contractor American Construction

on December 22, 2018.

"It has been an honor working with the Seattle District on this important navigation project. We truly value the partnership with the Corps and I am pleased to announce we have already seen the benefits of the project with an increase in the average tonnage of vessels calling Grays Harbor," said Executive Director Gary Nelson. "We also want to thank Senators Murray and Cantwell, and Congressman Kilmer for their ongoing support, as well as the State of Washington for partnering on this important project that will service the Port and our community well into the future."
