Overview

Temple Beth Shalom is a 450+ member Columbus-area Reform Jewish Congregation offering weekly Sabbath Services, religious and Hebrew schooling, Bar/Bat Mitzvah tutoring, personalized lifecycle observances, family and adult educational programming, conversion, pastoral counseling, social, charitable, and cultural activities, and much more.

Temple Beth Shalom was organized in December 1977 and is affiliated with the Union for Reform Judaism. Rabbi Benjy A. Bar-Lev has been with the congregation since 2008 and serves as TBS's Senior Rabbi. In 2017 Rabbi Lenette Herzog joined the congregation as our Assistant Rabbi and Director of Education. Cantorial soloist Gail Rose and musicians provide music for services, the religious and Hebrew schools, and other Temple events and activities. Rabbi Howard L. Apothaker, Ph.D. has served as TBS's Rabbi since 1980 and is now Rabbi Emeritus.
