REAR COMMODORE'S UPDATE:

In between recent frostbite races, Mike Saxe and I discussed the penalty turn, which occurs frequently in close quarters frostbite racing. The rule book says that a boat breaking a racing rule may take a penalty turn at the time of the incident and then continue racing. The rule calls for two circles (aka 720 degree penalty turn), but is often shortened to one circle if specified in the sailing instructions for a particular race. The 720 penalty turn was introduced as an alternative penalty in 1973. Before then, a boat breaking a rule had to retire from the race. I recall my excitement as a teenager being invited to crew for the best Atlantic Class skipper at my yacht club, sailing 45 minutes out to the course, fouling a starboard tack boat at the starting line, and sailing 45 minutes back to the club. This was before 1973. As many of you know, member Cindy Gibbs won the 1975 Adams Cup as the best female skipper in the United States. She qualified again a couple years later and the same thing happened to her that happened to my Atlantic skipper, ruining her chances in the multirace event. This was after the 720 penalty turn was introduced, but it seems that until 1997 it was up to the regatta organizer to decide whether to offer

it, and the Adams Cup did not. In 1997 it became the default penalty, meaning that it applied unless the sailing instructions said it did not. If it were not for the 360 penalty turn half the boats frostbiting wouldn't finish a race! On the other hand, the boats would have fewer dings.







WATERFRONT UPDATE:

GALLEY UPDATE:

Spring frostbiting means lots of wind. Sometimes an unexpectedly early and strong cold front means the sheets that went out at the windward mark will not come in at the leeward mark! Ask Ed Birch about that (frozen!). I was so glad to be home sick that day.

We have had lots of wind and great racing. Tom Atkinson, sailing Nautilus as the open boat, with a variety of crew (Mike Saxe, Glenn Jacobsen, Sharon Tracy, Matt Melius, and (this week Joan Kirsch) is close behind perennial EYC leader Carter Gowrie, while Sue Watts co-skippering with Jon Gibbs are closing the gap in third in Dauntless #38. Sam Berman and Matt Melius are breaking into the fleet well with increasingly strong finishes (including one just a few feet short of a first last week), after not scoring the first week, to try out sail with others. Week one was a good harbinger for ECYC. Fielding just two club boats only for the conditions that

just two club boats only for the conditions that day, Tom and Matt won the day, while Jon and Sam were a close second, with members Ed Birch and Jeff Going placing third. Sue Watts is now top notch both skippering and crewing and has visited the podium more than a few times. On week five Joan Kirsch made a very promising Fostbite debut to help me to break a long drought and win the day.

Carter Gowrie of EYC has definitely hit his stride, with a score of 1-3-1-1-1-1 on week four.
