2. A 50% deposit will be required to confirm your reservation for any trip
3. Payment in full will be required two meetings prior to the departure date. If payment is not

received by the end of the specified meeting night, your spot will be available to any interested party. (For example, if you are signing up for the April Pacific Dawn Trip then 100% payment is due at the February meeting.)

4. There will be no refunds until the Charter is full and the Club has been able to sell your reservation. The club makes no guarantee that we will be able to fill your reservation once the charter is full. You are responsible for finding a replacement and collecting payment.

5. All charters are open to members and guests.

Members Reports

Unfortunately because of a recent illness Member Don Udlock was unable to participate in the check presentation for Friends Of Rollo scheduled at the Fred Hall Show in Long Beach. However Don had his presentation speech prepared and provided it to us:

Imagine the excitement of a 10 or 11 year old kid growing up in the city when someone asks them if they would like to spend a day out on the ocean fishing. Even more when you tell them it will be completely free with everything they will need provided, even lunch. Well that is exactly what the group Friends of Rollo does for kids up and down the coast of California. It does not matter what the kid's background is, their social status, gender or anything else is, just that they would like to go fishing.

All of the above is true except for the free part, someone must bear the costs. This is where Friends of Rollo, a whole lot of volunteers, generous individuals and business' come in. Even though landings provide deep discounts, party boat trips are still expensive. Friends of Rollo's budget are made up entirely of donations of one type or another. A large portion of the operating budget is made up of the raffle of a beautiful boat, motor and trailer package, which to a large part is donated by very generous manufacturers. However another significant portion of their budget comes from various donors including individuals, businesses, fishing organizations and fishing clubs. One of those clubs is Turner's Outdoorsman Rod and Reel Club of Pasadena. The members conduct a raffle each year at our year end banquet for the specific purpose of raising money for Friends of Rollo. This year we are donating \$1200 to further their cause. It is our wish to challenge other fishing clubs to also support youth fishing programs. There are several excellent youth fishing programs in California which deserve our support, we have chosen Friends of Rollo and would encourage you to do likewise. Since its inception in 1999 Friends Of Rollo has taken 75.000 kids fishing, over 8000 in 2011.
