#### **ECYC Members Visit Yacht Clubs Near and Far**

### Our collection of burgees will soon have two new special additions.

ECYC member and world traveler Joyce Winterstein (it's her business!) and her husband Jeff recently visited the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania in Hobart, Australia. Here is her "log entry":

Jeff and I and a few friends, took a 12 day Australian cruise onboard Crystal Cruises. Ports included Melbourne, Adelaide, Hobart, Sydney and Brisbane. We thought Hobart would be

our opportunity for a burgee exchange. We received a welcoming email from Sonia Shelverton from the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania looking forward to our visit during our port call January 10 and 11.

Tasmania was discovered by Dutch explorer, Abel Tasman in 1642. The first settlement arrived in 1803 which consisted of (you guessed it) convicts and military guards. The penal colony established at Port Arthur was one of the harshest; housing the hardest criminals Britain and Ireland could send and



soon became Australia's largest in operation from 1830 until 1877. Port Arthur is now a major tourist area where visitors can also see the penitentiary.

Because of recent fires in and around Port Arthur, many roads were closed. But there was certainly enough to keep us busy for 2 days around Hobart including a visit Australia's oldest Brewery, the Cascade Brewery and a visit to the Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary to see Tasmanian Devils as well as kangaroos, blue tongued lizards (guess why the name), potoroos, emus, the Eastern Quoll, the Tasmanian Pademelon, the very shy Tasmanian Bettong and of course - koalas!!

Our visit to the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania was great fun. It was founded in 1859 as the

Tasmanian Yacht Club. Over the years, the club has had many homes, many names and has closed and open more times than they like to admit. Finally in 1908 a Royal Warrant was granted to "The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania". In 1910 the present burgee was designed and approved for use by members. Today it sits on a beautiful harbor with one of the largest marinas in Hobart. Indeed - what a view!

Sonia was there to greet us. After the official burgee exchange, we were given a brief tour

of the facility and invited to share in a great Aussie pastime - drinking and socializing! We quickly learned of their "rule" - if you wear a cap into the bar, you must pay for a round of drinks. As soon as they heard our accents, we were given a reprive. Our new friends gave us this year's racing caps from the Sydney - Hobart race, burgee pins and a beautiful hard cover book of the 100-year history of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania (1908 - 2008). Jeff and I are pleased to donate this book to the ECYC library.



In our hemisphere, members Jim and Susan Magaziner used our great reciprocal program to visit the Miami Yacht Club while visiting the Miami Boat Show last month. Susan reports:
