Severe Weather Policy

The following Severe Weather Policy for attendance at quarterly TVQA Board meetings is found in the TVQA Policies and Procedures revised May 2024.

The safety of the TVQA guild representatives is of utmost concern. Remember, your safety comes first! The following guidelines apply when the National Weather Service issues a severe weather warning:

If the schools in Rutherford County are closed on the day of the quarterly TVQA board meeting due to weather conditions, or if Rutherford County is under a severe weather warning, there will be no in-person TVQA board meeting. A Zoom meeting will be held and attendance at the zoom meeting will go toward the guilds' incentive. All guild presidents will be contacted, and they should share the information with their guild members.

If Board members' schools outside Rutherford County are closed or their weather is severe, they should use their best judgment in deciding whether to attend in-person or on Zoom. The members should notify one of the Executive Board if this occurs.

If you will not be at the TVQA meeting due to severe weather, contact the TVQA President, Vice President or Secretary either the night before the meeting or before 9:00 a.m. the day of the meeting.

TVQA BOARD MEETING May 9, 2025

The TVQA Quarterly board meeting was called to order at 10:03am. President Judith Thompson welcome everyone and opened with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. A guild roll call was done with the 27 members present.

The minutes from the previous meeting were presented in the newsletter, and a motion was made by Trish Harnen and seconded by Deb Hunt to accept them; they were unanimously approved.

Vice President Denni Green honored the Friendship Guild. It began in May 1995 by Mildred Locke, with 27 founding members. They currently hold a membership around 70 members, with 8 previous TVQA presidents from the group. They are an active guild, with multiple philanthropic endeavors.

Denni reminded everyone that event registrations are online. Assembly Day registration is open, and retreat registration will open soon.

President Judith Thompson gave a Presidents Report:

She let everyone know there is a need for several volunteer opportunities:

There is a need for a guild to host Assembly Day in 2026. With fewer guilds, the need to host will be more often than previously done.

We thank Kim Simpson for hosting the zoom link at previous meetings, but need a new volunteer to maintain the link at meetings. This is a four times a year role only at the meeting—no other prep work is needed. If no one steps up to do this at meetings we will no longer offer this option.

The following people have submitted their names for nomination. Voting today so please have your cards. Officers will be inducted into office at Assembly Day in July and will officiate at the August board meeting.

A motion was made by Trish Harnen and seconded by Carol Tessmer to adopt the proposed executive board as presented, and was accepted unanimously.

Vice-President Denni Green gave her report:

A. The Mystery Quilt's final clue has been posted, and a huge thank you is given to Anita Elliott for hosting the block. The clues will be left up for the rest of the year, and there is a plan for a mystery quilt parade at Assembly Day. Please let the board know if you have enjoyed the mystery quilt and would like for this activity to continue going forward.

B. All TVQA newsletters from the beginning of the association are on the website under the members only section. We have had 14 newsletter editors, and a thank you was extended to Denni Green for hunting down all the missing newsletters, to Lezleigh Kleibrink for scanning them all in, and to Chris White for uploading all to the website. This will preserve our history for all to have at their fingertips.

Secretary Lezleigh Kleibrink had no news to share.

Treasurer Sheila Schmaedig let all know the current account balance stands at \$18501.11. She also reminded all that online registration for all TVQA events streamlines receiving the information, and allows receiving funds quickly. The service charge for paying online is about the same as a stamp when paying dues.

Judith reminded members that at future board meetings, any of the coordinators or representatives should send information for the agenda to TVQA President by the Friday before the board meeting. Members with special announcements should also send that information (i.e., Assembly Day, Spring Seminar, etc.)

Newsletter editor Elaine Jackson gave the reminder about newsletters:

Guild news articles are to be sent to the newsletter editor by the 20th of the month after a board meeting. The next due date is March 20 for content for the April newsletter. Guild presidents, please inform your guild reporter of the following submission guidelines (also available on the first page of the Guild News section of every newsletter).

- Send your news via email to tvqanewsletter@gmail.com. (Please do not send your article as a reply to a reminder email you may receive; instead start a new email to submit your article.
- Include your guild's name in the subject line of your email. Prepare your news in MS Word and attach the document to your email, OR if your article is short, you may send it within the test of the email instead. DO NOT send your article as a .pdf file or a.jpg file.
- If you send pictures, please send them as attachments to your email (jpg files are preferred) and identify the activity and the people in each picture. Be sure to verify the spelling of all names.

Webmaster Chris White reminds all that the website password will be changing shortly. You will be informed of that as soon as it occurs. The guild presidents will be informed of the new password to share with their members, and MAL liaison Lezleigh Kleibrink will share with MALs.

Regional Fair chair Lezleigh Kleibrink reminded all that anyone living in Tennessee is welcome to enter the Nashville Fair in September. This works well for any county without a fair to be able to qualify for the State Fair. Online registration is hoped to be in July.

Membership Brenda Willis let all know member directories for our 445 members and 16 lifetime members for 2025 are on the website, and membership letters have been emailed to all members. If you have questions contact Brenda Willis.

Retreat Coordinator Trish Harnen reported that fall retreat is October 1-5 at St Mary's in Sewanee TN, and registration will be online soon. Presidents and the MAL liaison will disseminate the open registration as soon as it becomes available. Spring retreat will be March 4-8, 2026. You have the option to come as a day camper, to stay at a local hotel, or stay on site at St Mary's. They offer a per meal option, and can accommodate food restrictions.

Assembly Day Chair Carol Tessmer let members know:

they have 246 registered for this year's event--there is a capacity of 360. Registration is open until June 12 for planning purposes.

If you have not received an automated confirmation from Jotform of your registration, please let Carol know via email at caroll0303@yahoo.com.

If you have not paid for your box lunch, please do so now.

They are excited that their vendor allotment is full!

If your guild has an event to advertise, please let Carol know as there will be a table to set up for this. Please bring your raffle basket the day of, and make sure they have a cost limit of \$50-60. Smaller baskets are preferred so that there is a chance for more members to win one.

At our quarterly meetings, donations of canned or packaged food to support food box at Living Faith Ministries are appreciated. The association is supporting our VA system with wheelchair quilts. If each guild could make

at least one wheelchair quilt per board meeting it would be VERY appreciated. A sample pattern is provided on our website.

A show and tell was given from new member Sandra Chandler of her beautiful quilted jacket. She let members know of her extensive teaching, and she would love to come to teach at your guild. Please check her work out at @sandraleedesign on Instagram.

Door prizes from boutique remnants were given.

All were invited to join the board for lunch at Hickory Falls at 999 Industrial Blvd. The meeting was adjourned at 11:18am.

TVQA's 2025 Mystery Quilt












