

LOUISIANA ASSOCIATION OF CONSERVATION DISTRICTS Annual Meeting, Lafayette, Louisiana January 10-13, 2016

In November, Anita Manshack, Sabine Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) Program Assistant, submitted the nomination of TBLA to LACD on behalf of Pat Boudreaux, LACD Area I Vice President. As many of you know, the Toledo Bend Lake Association (TBLA) is dedicated to maintaining and improving the quality of Toledo Bend Lake and the amenities surrounding it. One of TBLA's core values is to: "Promote youth participation to increase interest in outdoor recreational activities in the Lake area." To that end, TBLA partnered with the SWCD to revive and fund the local Fish Fest, a youth fishing tournament that is very popular on Toledo Bend Lake. This Fest was once discontinued due to costs associated with it. It was revamped and supported by other sponsors for a few years before being picked up by TBLA. In 2014, TBLA donated \$1,500 to support the event. They doubled their donation to \$3,000 in 2015 and plan to continue sponsoring the Annual TBLA/SWCS Youth Fish Fest Tournament, providing t-shirts and assistance.

Ms. Manshack states, "Over the last 16 years thousands of children have fished the waters of Toledo Bend Lake at our tournaments. Annually we provide the opportunity to register 150 youth to experience an all-expense paid fun day of fishing thanks to the TBLA. The Sabine SWCD is over-joyed to be the recipient of these funds. As our state funds continue to dwindle we must seek new partners to continue providing funds for our conservation education projects."

TBLA Board of Directors actions – The Board addressed the following at the January 26 meeting:

- Approved a tentative 2016 Budget of approximately \$107,000 depending on funds raised at the Bass Unlimited Back A Great Fighter fundraiser.
- Approved establishing an additional lunker bass weigh station on the Lake at Keith's Toledo Bend Tackle store next to the Carrice Creek Bridge and public boat ramp on TX Highway 103, west of the Pendleton Bridge.
- Discussed TBLA participation in the Keep Toledo Bend Country Clean Adopt A Highway program by committing to pick up trash along LA Highway 191 S. from Toledo Town to the Lanana Bridge, if enough members agree to participate.
- Agreed to purchase four additional tables and chairs to be used at SCOA for socials and other events.

<u>Toledo Bend Lunker Bass Program update</u> -- The 2015-2016 TBLA Toledo Bend Lunker Bass Program runs from May 18, 2015 through May 19, 2016. As of January 23, 2016, 51 lunker bass, weighing 10 lbs. or greater, have been registered in the program. This is 33 more lunkers than were registered at this time during last year's record-breaking 81 registered lunkers. Check the big fish out on our <u>Toledo Bend Lunker Bass Facebook page</u>. Better yet, get out there, catch your own lunker, register it and get your photograph on Facebook, as well as a free replica at the Toledo Bend Sealy Outdoors Big Bass Splash on May 22, 2016. Last year 63 lunkers were caught between Jan. 24 and May 17, the peak of the season.

<u>Toledo Bend Lake level</u> was 172.51 ft. msl, at 9:30 a.m. Wed., Jan. 27, 2016. SRA is presently running Generator 1 - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, until further notice. Generator 2 is down. Seven Spillway Gates are open at 1 ft. and 2 gates at 2 ft.
