ORDINANCE NO. 89-2

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN, MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS ASCERTAINING THE PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LABORERS, WORKMEN AND MECHANICS EMPLOYED ON PUBLIC WORKS OF SAID VILLAGE

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1 through 39s-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1987; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF CHAPIN investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workmen in the locality of said Village employed in performing construction of public works for said Village exclusive of maintenance work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN:

Section 1: To the extent and as required by "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of

this Village, is hereby ascertained to be the same prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Morgan County area as attached hereto and made a part hereof and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

Section 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this Village to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

Section 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village, this determination of such prevailing rate of wages.

Section 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates, and the particular class of workmen whose wages will be affected by such rates.

Section 5: The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

Section 6: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this

ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR PREVAILING WAGES FOR MORGAN COUNTY EFFECTIVE 06/01/89

These Prevailing Wages shall be included in the contracts and their advertised specifications to which any public body, as defined in Section 2 of the Prevailing Wage Act ([1]. Rev. Stat. 1987, Ch. 48, par. 1981), is a party, for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and/or repair of public buildings or public works within the State of Illinois which requires or involves the employment of laborers, workers, and mechanics, and owner/operators. Minimum wages, overtime rate and tringe benefits certified herein shall be paid. This scale of prevailing wages to be paid shall be posted by the contractor in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site of work. This determination is the property of the Illinois Department of Labor and shall not be aftered without their consent in writing.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply:

New rears Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day.
Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Honday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

THULK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION-MORGAN COUNTY

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, tructure helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or men to and from and on-the-job site, ...

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6.000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Orivers on water pulls, mechanics and working foremen, and dispatchers.

Air compressors (six to eight): Boosters and Heaters; Asphalt Distributors, Asphalt Plant Fireman, Oller on Two Paving Mixers when used in Tandem; Boom or Winch Trucks; Building Elevators; Buil Floats or Flexplanes; Concrete Finishing Machine; Concrete Saws, Self-Propelled; Concrete Spreading Machines; Gravel or Stone Spreader, Power Operated; Hoist, Automatic; Hoist with One Drum and One Load Line; Mud Jacks; Post Hole Digger, Mechanical; Road or Street Sweeper, Self-Propelled; Seaman Tiller; Straw Machine; Vibratory Compactor; Well Drill Machines; Scissors Hoist.

Uther Classifications of Work:

for definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If there is no such definition on file, the Bureau of Labor Statistics SIC list will be used. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist the reference in this document. Further, if no such neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination.

Prevailing rates of wages have been determined for the following classifications which may not be listed: barber, hairdresser and cosmetologist; baker; tartender; cook (Cook, Sangamon); elevator operator; food service worker (Cook, Sangamon, U of I-C); furniture mover (Cook); junitor (Cook, Racon); maintenance worker-power plant; millwright; moving picture mathine operator; operating engineer-stationary, sewage disposal and water plant, floating platform; patrol officer (Cook); piledriver; railroad construction and maintenance worker; security guard; stationary fireman; sound technician; telecommunication service technician; theatrical stage employee; tug boat operator; underwater diver.
