The Contemporary Worship Team met on January 11, 2017 to plan for February's services. Trustees' Report.....

At their January meeting the Trustees received a report from Michael Hudock of Hudock Capital Group. Current value of the investment portfolio is \$966,731. It was noted that the withdrawals in 2015 totaled \$160,500 and in 2016 it was \$245,000. (Note: over \$60,000 each year has been needed for the deficit in Current Expense.) The Trustees plan to receive a report regarding the Prudential investment accounts from their representatives during their February meeting.

Renovations to the basement continue. Except for a few finishing touches the restrooms are completed. The Trustees prefer the restrooms not be used until the renovations to the Social Hall are completed. Speaking of the Social Hall, the walls are painted, and new ceiling and lighting has been installed. As of this writing we haven't been provided a date for the installation of the flooring. The finishing touch will be new stair treads on the newly painted stairway.

After prayerful consideration the Trustees have approved proposals from T-Ross Brothers and Air Tech HVAC to renovate the entire first floor of the Parish House. As our paid staff has grown it is getting more and more difficult for everyone to work out of one small office. At the conclusion of the project, for the first time in many years the Pastor will have his/her own office.

Ad Board

Bethany is again engaged in helping occasionally with the weekly Community dinners at St. Andrew's. We will assist with the meal on Monday, February 13, as servers and possibly also as cooks. More detail about the event appears elsewhere in this newsletter.

The Missions Team has been in touch with Milton officials about the possibility of opening up Bethany to the community as part of a special celebration on Sunday, February 26 in connection with the Borough's bicentennial, and the Board has voted to approve and pursue this outreach.

There have recently been some significant problems with the hand-held microphone that's used in the church's main sanctuary, and we have given Susquehanna Valley Sound & Vision permission, based on their diagnosis, to quote us on a replacement for it. That microphone is not only used as a mobile unit for the benefit of traditional service congregants, it also comes into play as a key component of our blended services, when our Music Director incorporates it into his hookup to sing and play worship tunes. (Here it should be noted that the handhelds in the main sanctuary and the Contemporary service area are not interchangeable, because the two systems operate on different frequencies. Hence, replacing the former is the only option.)

SVSV has also been engaged to give our whole main sanctuary sound system a thorough cleaning, which, they assure us, is all it needs to bring it to top operating condition again.

The church makes a yearly donation to the Milton Fire Department, and the Board has approved that expenditure again for 2017.

The Board acknowledges, with regret but with full understanding, the recent resignations of two members of the Pastor/Staff/Parish Relations Committee. Those folks have the great thanks of the church governance body and entire Bethany family for the jobs they did so well and the many services they rendered "above and beyond" in the execution of their respective PSPRC duties. The search for their successors begins immediately.

Cost analysis leads us to reconsider who we should have as the generation-transmission supplier of electric power to the church, the Parish House, and the Parsonage. The Board and the Finance Committee have given Trustees the go-ahead to research the matter and choose a different company.
