The March 1, 2021 meeting of Crestwood Association was called to order by President, Janine Lund at 7:03 p.m. Janine read the mission of the Association and welcomed all in attendance: A quorum was present.

The minutes of the January 16 meeting were accepted with the correction of the addition of the date of the meeting. The Secretary read the slate of Officers for 2021-22: President, Janine Lund (until a replacement is found); VP, Holly Schur; Membership Chair, Kristin Glass; Treasurer, Rozi Stone, and Secretary, Mary Beth Marsh.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SECURITY: Frank Diaz reported thefts in the neighborhood, including one catalytic converter stolen for the scrap metal, and a package taken from the 300 block of N. Bailey. There have been complaints of speeders through the neighborhood, as well. NPO Moncada requested that F. Diaz be notified as to the area and the date and time speeders are seen to better allow him to catch them. He suggested a notation be made in the newsletter requesting the same of members.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Held until April 5 meeting when Treasurer, Rozi Stone is in attendance.

WATER MAIN BREAKS: Several breaks occurred during the extreme weather from February 14 – 19, with temporary fixes at some of the locations. Members agreed that the communication to residents by the City was severely lacking. K. Kelly will contact Mattie Gibbs to find out if there is more we need to know regarding the City's early warning systems.

APRIL 5 ASSOCIATION MEETING: District 7 candidates will be invited to speak. A committee including K. Kelly, G. Davis, L. Colegrove, and MB Marsh will formulate the protocol for the presentations and invite the candidates to speak at the meeting. A second invitation, closer to the June runoff, may be made to the candidates. J. Lund would like the maximum meeting time

to be 1.5 hours, and the candidates will speak before the business portion. J. Lund will draft a letter to the Westside Alliance letting them know we will host our own meeting for the candidates and send to B. Schur to email to members. K. Kelly will have all attendees register to attend.

EASTER CELEBRATION: Last year's COVID safe celebration will be duplicated with Analisa Istre driven around in the bunny suit. The bunny suit, however, needs to be replaced. A. Istre suggested she be able to hand out small packets of candy to the children, after the packets have been untouched for 3 days for safety. H. Schur will get the final plan. J. Lund would like the information to go into the April 3 newsletter.

NUSA CONFERENCE: (Neighborhoods USA) will allow one participant from each neighborhood association to attend free of charge. It will be held virtually, May 19-26, 2021. A motion was made and accepted to have J. Lund attend the conference on behalf of the Association.

NEW BUSINESS: The new police chief will be invited to speak at the Association's May meeting. J. Lund will email Matti Gibbs to inform her; K. Kelly will inform NPO Moncada.

L. Colegrove relayed his positive experience with Oncor and ATT regarding a leaning power pole on his property. He requested that there be a notation in the newsletter to remind members to be sure to call Oncor when they see damage to power lines.
