One particular item was the need of Lions help to communicate with their local organizations to help promote the camp's goal to increase youth attendance. (Schools, businesses, other civic groups).

After a great meal and hopefully some informative information about the camp, Mr. Seabrook presented the camp with a new Sony Blu-ray player.

Support:

From District O the Bainbridge Club has transported several of our adult campers who live in their area to the camp each year. They also have provided camper sponsorships for some these campers. I would like to thank Ms. Jeanette Sickle for bringing one of our campers, (Tonya) to the meeting. Tonya has been attending camp for many years. She loves to sing in the annual talent show we have for the campers each session. It was great to see Tonya and I was glad that she was able to attend a Lions Club meeting.

With the location of both of these clubs about four to five hours away it is hard for someone from the camp to go and speak directly to their clubs. 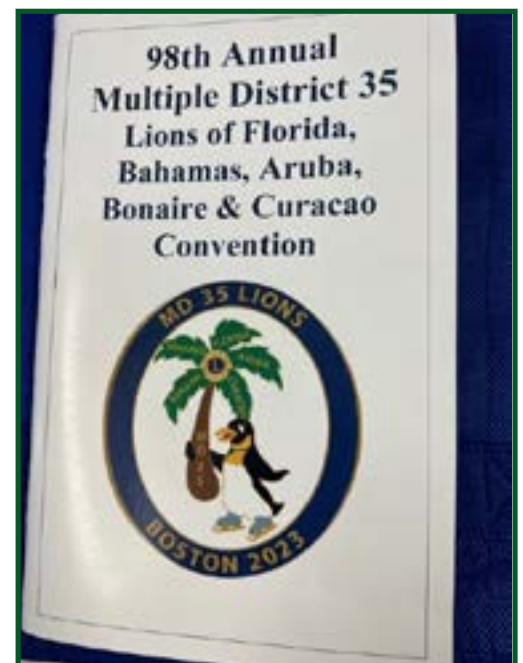
NOTE: Hal is looking for volunteers to help with his annual Goalball tournament in Atlanta. Check out the information posted in this newsletter.

Sitting in the stands and watching the games was a great time to connect with parents of these students. Some of them I have had the privilege of their child attending camp in the past. One of which was Owen Mann. Let me tell you, this young fellow has grown a lot since I last saw him.

I know some of you have participated in a friendly game of goalball here at the camp on Lions Day. It is a friendly game of which the campers take it easy on you. Go watch a real game and see how they sacrifice themselves during the game. It can be painful. That ball may only weigh three lbs. but when it comes at you at high speed and you don't know exactly where it will connect to your body, Ouch!! It will bring tears to your eyes.

I will say, when a player gets hit and is in need of assistance, coaches and ref's all stop and check on the



child. Making sure they are okay before play resumes.

How can you help?

It has been a busy couple of months here at the Georgia Lions Camp, Inc. planning for summer camp is in full swing. Over the past couple of months, I have visited many clubs and attended a couple of District meetings. Always trying to keep you informed. Letting you know the accomplishments of the camp and the needs. Some of you have asked. Do you need volunteers? The answer will always be yes. The requirement will be, I need you to come help where help is needed the most.

Right now, that could be in the kitchen. For the past two years we have only had two summer cooks. One for each year. This is a demanding job. Hard on one person. Mrs. Gail has always been a big help with our kitchen staff and supervision needs. During camp she will be in the kitchen by 6:00 am and back over at the office at 9:00 am. Back and to checking on where they need help the most. Help during the evening meal and maybe home by 7:00 pm that evening. She goes way beyond her job duties to make sure all campers are provided for at meal times.

Summer counselors have stepped up and helped where they could. Helping clean after meals. Moving or setting up tables and chairs. Distribute pre-made plates. Making sure that the only thing the cook did was, cook and prepare the meals.

Some have offered to come help for a week or two this summer. Please confirm when you can come.

Even if we are lucky enough to get a full kitchen crew this year, I can still put you to work somewhere.

Needs in the kitchen. Cooking, cleaning, serving, prepping, cleaning some more. Where ever I need you the most is where you can help. Please don't wait until camp is about to start to commit.

You will work hard and you will be tired, but when you get to spend a little meal time with the campers it will make it all worthwhile.

Needs List 2023: updated 5/11/2023

Many have asked what does the camp need?

The following items will help the daily maintenance and other operations of the camp.

1. Bottle Water- 16oz. by the case
2. PowerAde/Gatorade sports drinks- single serve bottles/24 to a case (**The lime and red are favorite flavors**)
3. Disposable ponchos for rainy days – 50 – these can be found at dollar stores or dollar general
4. Dish towels for the kitchen
5. 13-gallon trash bags
6. 60-gallon industrial size garbage bags
7. Gallon size bleach- Five cases of 6 bottles per case
8. Lysol disinfectant spray- 2 cases of 6? cans per case
9. Spray cans of room deodorizer- 20 cans of spray
10. Laundry detergent- gallon size preferable- 3 cases of 6? Bottles per case
11. Windex window cleaner- 2 cases of 6 per case
12. Clorox disinfectant spray bottles – 2 cases of 6 per case-(32 oz.)
13. Toilet Tissue – any brand
14. Bug spray- non- DEET and DEET accepted. -20 cans spray or pump
- 15. Wasp Spray- Black Flag brand preferred. 2 cases of 12 per case.**
- 16. Ant poison- here at the camp we have “ANT” issues, we need your help- bags of poison or industrial strength liquid needed. You can never ask for enough of this. All donations appreciated.**
17. 50-1 mix for weed eaters and lawn maintenance tools used here at the camp. 24 bottles
18. 5W30 motor oil- 1 case of 12 qtrs. Per case
19. 10W30 motor oil- 1 case of 12 qtrs. per case
20. Copy paper for the office
21. AA, AAA and 9V Batteries

All of the above items listed are used all through the year as needed.

1. Pressure Wash all buildings
2. Playground border fence needs repair and repainted
3. Playground needs limbs of tree trimmed to adult head height.
4. Paint the Water Tank
5. Replace weathered boards on wooden ramps at the exits of the main dormitory and repaint
6. Clean Low Ropes Course and Amphitheater areas
7. Weed pulling, edging, raking, wheel barrow use, and sanitation are many other jobs to be done during this work session. BRING your gloves and definitely some BUG SPRAY!!
8. Repair the Whale Watch element at the Low Ropes Course
9. Nature Trail –build up low lying areas we continue to need Two loads of crushed asphalt and Two loads of fill dirt.
10. Paint water heater room located behind the newly renovated Staff Building.
11. Paint the pump house at the pond
12. Paint sidewalks at the exit doors to the bunkhouse.
13. Repair Emergency exit door at restrooms in the Dining Hall.
14. Clean and paint swing frames at the fire pit area.
15. Railing and post need repair at the back double door entrance to the dining hall
16. Sitting Swings at the fire pit need to be cleaned and painted.
17. Activity Site Warning signs have been replaced and repaired but framing needs cleaning and painting.
18. Repaint Dining Hall.
19. Lights in Large Dormitory and Bunkhouse Dormitory still need to be converted to LED bulbs.
20. Pull out canoes and see which ones need repairing
21. Repair broken board on canoe cart
22. Tin roof over bleachers at horse arena needs to be re-applied
23. Pressure wash poolside deck
24. Fence repair (several post and rails have decayed and broken)
25. Fence is leaning at rental house needs to be secured properly
26. Low hanging limbs over the road that access' RVs to the back of the camp need trimming. Man-lift, chain saws will be needed
27. All cabinets in the main dorm need to be checked for easy opening and closing-repair those that need repairing
28. Need some shower heads replaced in the main dormitory
