

**Change in Abundance with God -----
-----And Pastor Eric**

⁹I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture. ¹⁰The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

¹¹I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. - John 10:9-11

²⁸I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. ³⁰The Father and I are one." - John 10:29-30

I was paying for a box of pens at the store last week and the clerk checked me at the register. He looked at me and declared that the pens will be four dollars and change. I was startled because I had not heard the word "change" used in that context in a long time. How many of us walk around with change in our pockets, or purses? What an interesting word "change." This word calls forth both hope and fear at the same time. I learned early on that "change is the only true constant in life" and that idea gives me a bit of comfort, I guess. God created humanity with an enormous capacity to adapt to change which separates us from many species on our planet. We have a way of transcending the moment and predicting possible outcomes and innovating in response to changes in our environment - as the psalmist writes, "we are beautifully and wonderfully made."

How we receive change in our life has an impact on the life of abundance that Jesus refers to in John 10.

Jesus declares that he has come that we might have life – life in all its fullness! He does not refer to quantity of life as we understand it but depth of life by savoring it as we receive it from and with God. No matter what happens in life we face it, and experience it with God, the shepherd of life and the ultimate change agent. Jesus came to make sure that we would receive the full life with God that we once had in the garden of Eden before death's grip on us began to choke out life and corrupt us – separate us and drive us into hiding from God and one another. Hiding from life itself and its bounteous joy 😊

I was in a similar store line recently with a cup of coffee. I had a rough day and needed a bit of a “pick me up.” I approached the counter and the clerk looked at me and said, “Good afternoon, sir! That will be two dollars and seventy cents please.” I pulled out two dollars but only had fifty cents in change. I looked up at him and said, “I’ve got a five here somewhere?” He smiled and replied, “No problem. It’s on me!” And he pulled three dollars out of his pocket and put it in the register! He told me that I looked like I needed it! I replied, “Thank you and God bless!” and he replied with a big smile, “He just did!” I left with a cup of coffee and a new friend whose coffee line I began to frequent more often.

I know it might seem like a small encounter and it might happen to you now and then, but I see it as that abundance at work. Jesus allows me to experience life in those mustard seed moments and appreciate the value and opportunities that they truly are. When I receive change like a random cup of coffee then I can embrace the fullness of possibility with hope no matter what change comes my way because God is with me.

Let us pray. ***Gracious God, shepherd me always in Jesus’ name. Amen.***




New Member Orientation Meetings




CONGRATULATIONS TO ONE MORE COLLEGE GRADUATE!

Book Review: The Hiding Place by Corrie ten Boom with John & Elizabeth Sherrill

The Hiding Place is the story of Cornelia "Corrie" ten Boom, a Dutch woman, and her family who have a deep love for the Lord, but end up caught up in Hitler's Nazi terror campaign during WWII. Corrie and her father and siblings end up as political prisoners of the Nazi's because they hid Jews in their family watch shop/home. Eventually, Corrie and her sister, Betsie, are taken to Ravensbruck Concentration Camp. Instead of wallowing in their losses and horrible living conditions, the ten Boom sisters make it their mission to spread the story of Jesus Christ to not only their fellow prisoners, but also their German captors. I was impressed by how Betsie, time and time again, would forgive those who mistreated her and pray for their safety and salvation. After Corrie is released from Ravensbruck, she fulfills Betsie's dream of creating a place of healing for those affected by the war in any way, even those who helped the Germans. This book is an uplifting true story of Jesus' healing power provided through the life of ordinary people.



Here we are again. Ten years ago, Palestine embarked on a discernment journey with Pastor David Cline and the Palestine Discernment team. Out of that experience came eight goals which have propelled us into God’s future with a new staff, new worship aides, and some renewed and updated facilities. We began a “listening in love” project in 2019 which got sidelined due to the pandemic and derecho events. Our congregation thrived through these challenging times and has changed in the process!

Our congregation council put together a new listening team of five people who will engage the community, the membership, and our partners in service to ask what God is up to in our midst. Through the summer months, the team will sponsor experiences to promote discussion and get feedback on a few questions that will help spark our hearts and minds about our church and community.

We will use the following:

1. **Pew Offerings** – Questions will be asked of the congregation to serve as part of our offering response to God on a given Sunday. This exercise will help us foster gratitude and give thoughtful response to God’s Word in the context of Sunday worship.

2. Congregation Query – On the 2nd and 4th Sundays, we will pose a question for the congregation and give a few minutes to think and discuss and after worship a space will be offered for further conversation and response which will be guided by one of the team members.

The team has other strategies in mind for early Fall; however, for the summer months these will be our primary strategies. Please keep the team and our congregation of Palestine in prayer as we ask, seek and knock at the Holy Spirit's door!
