Aloha Kakou,

In my first parish, in Montana in the 1980s, several of my members were ranchers. One rancher in particular was full of witty remarks, that he loved to toss my way. One of his favorites was, "He's lower than a snake's belly in a wagon rut." Way more meaningful in Montana, where rattlers were frequently found, although rarely in wagon ruts. Perhaps less helpful here in Hawaii, where, technically, we have no snakes. But you do get a vivid image of someone less -than-reputable, don't you?

Being a sheep rancher, the other witticism that kept tripping off his lips was, "Sheep were born to die." If they could find a way to expire and leave this earth, they would, even without the help of the coyotes that were constantly roaming on the edge of their existence. If there was a disease they could get, they would. If there was a ravine or coulee' they could fall into, they would. Sometimes it seemed if they slept too long, they would just never wake up.

Sheep were born to die. I think of that often in Advent and Christmas. It helps me keep the birth of Jesus in perspective. It keeps me from turning the season into a cheesy, sentimental moment.

Jesus was born to die. I recall that Martin Luther once said something like that. Like my sheep rancher.

Incarnate Word. God-in-the-flesh. The Crucified God. This is what Advent in December is all about: anticipating the determinedly loving presence of God in our all-too-human lives from birth to death.
