PESC is collaborating throughout education and with the strength it derives from the actions and involvement of its membership; PESC is activating interoperability in higher education.

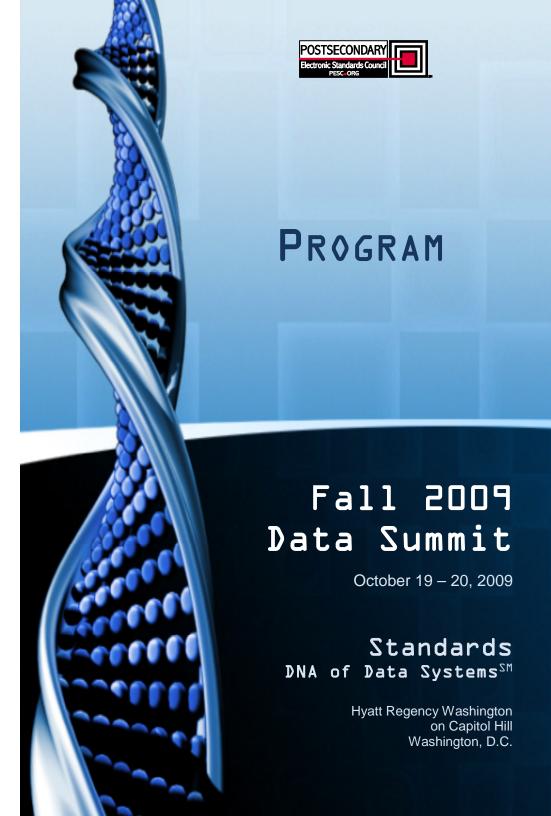
