SPANISH VALLEY WATER & SEWER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Regular meeting ----- April 15, 1992

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, George M. White at 7:00 P.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were Bud Cunningham, Neal Dalton and Dan Holyoak.

ATTENDANCE

Others present were Kim McDougald, Ray Holyoak, Ron Holyoak, Kathryn Holyoak, Paul Morris, Mr. & Mrs. Joe West, J. W. Nelson, Shelby Hatch.

Roberta read the minutes of the meeting of March MINUTES 18 and April 1, 1992. The Chair declared that the minutes stand as read.

Kim McDougald stated that Canyonlands Field In- McDOUGALD OIL stitute has bought the lower property at McDougald Oil and she had paid the connection fees to have separate water and sewer connections installed to the upper property. process of laying a line to that property they discovered a tremendous leak and that Mary Plumb's water system was inter-connected to their line. Over the winter this line had used 595 thousand gallons and Kim asked if there was any relief the Board could give her for this bill. According to Mike Wynn, renter of the upper property, this leak has been there since the fall and the computer print out of her billing record bears this out. Older records were consulted as to earlier use. After a discussion, Dan moved the average bill be charged plus they pay the rate we pay GCWCD for the overage, making a water bill of \$240.00. Bud seconded. MO-TION CARRIED.

Ron Holyoak stated he was here on behalf of Ray RAY ${\tt HOLYOAK}$ Holyoak, and he would like to question the status of Ray's SEWER BILL connection and his monthly billing under the mandatory sewer connection ordinance. He stated that Ray would like to turn over one of his two free connections given for easements for the sewer billing to date, and that Ray felt under his agreement with the district he not be billed further until he actually connected to the sewer. After a discussion, it was pointed out that if his billing were wiped out, the District would have to do it for everyone not connecting to the sewer and not paying the mandatory fee. Dale suggested the minutes be searched for the records on the phase 1 sewer as our file showed only one connection given for a right of way on phase II Sewer. Neal moved to award the forgiveness of the prior fees in exchange for the connection, leaving Mr. Holyoak one free connection, and suspend his billing until he hooks up. Dan seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

tion to J. W. Nelson, who according to the Divisions of Licenses, has not the correct license for putting in a culinary water line. Apparently the drinking water bureau thought and told Dale that a general contractor's license was sufficient. When he contacted the licensing bureau, he was told an E-100 or an S-410 was necessary. Jim Nelson has a B-100 license. Jim stated that he had asked Dale told the Board he Construction to umbrella him. thought the correct licensee would have to have submitted the original bid. George suggested the District not waive the performance bond. Dale stated that this job was so small that a performance bond should not be necessary. After a discussion, Dan moved J. W. Nelson go ahead with the job under Boulden's license and Dale's supervision. seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Jim Nelson then asked the board if they would take culinary water across the highway, and told them that other people wanted water on that side of the highway. Dale stated he had asked about the cost of boring a 6" line under the highway, and the cost for a 6" line was about \$50,000.00. Jim stated that a 2" line could be punched through. The material would cost about \$500.00. Dale asked if Hatch's easement was not a subdivision utility easement we had planned on using, and we could not vacate an easement not specifically given to us. Dan moved that if a specific SVW & SID easement is found for either Hatch or Nodine, we will vacate the Neal seconded. MOTION CARRIED. easement.

Dale reported on a study on sewer connections show-SEWER CONing customers with connections not using, vacant lots with NECTION connections and not using. Factoring in these vacancies, AVAILABILITY the District has about 100 sewer connections left. discussed purchasing additional connections with the mayor, who had been on the agenda tonight, but canceled. Dale has asked the District be on the agenda at the next City Council meeting, and would like to be on the agenda at the work meeting in the first part of their meeting and asked board memSVW & SID - April 15, 1992 - Page 3 bers to attend if possible.
