

OUR PARISH STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE CAMPAIGN **CONTINUES**

Our Parish Stewardship of Treasure Campaign continues. Its purpose is to provide for our parish' ordinary income used to address the financial needs of our parish supporting all of its work and

ministries. This campaign is different from the Annual Catholic Appeal in the spring which supports the needs of the broader Archdiocese. Our goal this year is \$358,912. To *date* \$25,010 *has been received in stewardship pledges which* represents 8% participation for our parish. All proceeds remain in our Parish. These funds specifically support parish ministries, sacramental preparation, church and building maintenance and our staff and priest's needs. THE CATECHISM OF THE **CATHOLIC CHURCH**

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 9/10,

The Fruits of Holy Communion

1396 The unity of the Mystical Body. the Eucharist makes the Church. Those who receive the Eucharist

are united more closely to Christ. Through it Christ unites them to all the faithful in one body - the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism. In Baptism we have been called to form but one body. The Eucharist fulfills this call: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread: "If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond "Amen" ("yes, it is true!") and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, "the Body of Christ" and respond "Amen." Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true.

CATECISMO DE LA **IGLESIA CATOLICA**

Los frutos de la comunión

1396 La unidad del Cuerpo místico: La Eucaristía hace la Iglesia. Los que reciben la Eucaristía se unen más estrechamente a Cristo. Por ello mismo, Cristo los une a todos los fieles en un solo cuerpo: la Iglesia. La comunión renueva, fortifica, profundiza esta incorporación a la Iglesia realizada ya por el Bautismo. En el Bautismo fuimos llamados a no formar más que un solo cuerpo (cf 1 Co 12,13). La Eucaristía realiza esta llamada: "El cáliz de bendición que bendecimos ¿no es acaso comunión con la sangre de Cristo? y el pan que partimos ¿no es comunión con el Cuerpo de Cristo? Porque aun siendo muchos, un solo pan y un solo cuerpo somos, pues todos participamos de un solo pan" (1 Co 10,16-17):«Si vosotros mismos sois Cuerpo y miembros de Cristo, sois el sacramento que es puesto sobre la mesa del Señor, y recibís este sacramento vuestro. Respondéis "Amén" [es decir, "sí", "es verdad"] a lo que recibís, con lo que, respondiendo, lo reafirmáis. Oyes decir "el Cuerpo de Cristo", y respondes "amén". Por lo tanto, sé tú verdadero miembro de Cristo para que tu "amén" sea también verdadero» (San Agustín, Sermo 272).

ST. FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI Feast Day November 13

Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to become a

valiant woman doing the work of Christ. Pope Leo XIII urged her to go west to the United States despite her dream of going to China. She traveled with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there. She found disappointment and difficulties with every step and the archbishop advised her to return to Italy. Through her dedication and compassion she went on to found 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Her example speaks to millions who may face rising health care costs or who have little or no access to medical care.
