







Once again, please be patient with the town staff as they clear the streets and sidewalks in town. There has been quite a bit of snow, and the removal takes a while to get done. If there is any way to keep your vehicles off the street when plows will be coming, please do so. Maintenance crews are doing their best to keep up, and they attempt to NOT block your driveway with snow, but sometimes there is no way to avoid it. If a street or portion of one gets missed, please call the town hall and leave a message. We will do everything we can to help.

Per the Rockford Snow Plow Policy...
The Public Works operator will
decide when to begin snow or ice
control operations. The criteria for
that decision will be:

Snow accumulation of four inches or more with the exception of East Emma Street which will be plowed at about two inches of snowfall.

Time of snowfall in relationship to heavy use of streets

RESIDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY

Residents are responsible for snow removal on the sidewalks in front of their property. The town is not responsible for driveways.
