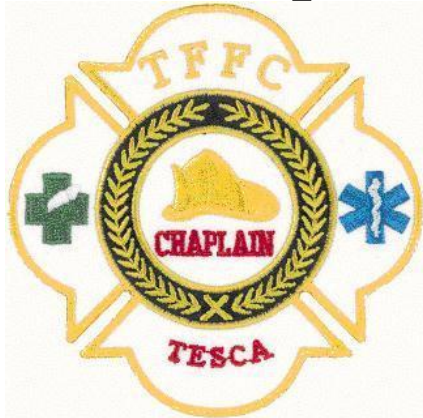

Summer 2024 Training Workshops

Advanced Chaplain Field Operations

Portland, TN - 8 PM on 20 Jun - 3 PM on 22 Jun

Unlike any class you have ever taken before. Includes advanced tools for disasters, field communications, establishing and maintaining short-term lodging, outdoor operations packing lists, providing healthy and safe rehab, death notification practical experience, and nighttime operational safety. This course fee includes lodging in field conditions and all meals. We will have two nighttime exercises during this class. **(\$250)**

Stress Management for the Trauma Provider

Bell Buckle, TN – 29-30 Jul, 8-5 both days

For those who work with traumatized people. Explore the “Stress Continuum” of eustress, traumatic stress, burnout, counter-transference, compassion fatigue, and vicarious traumatization which may occur as a result of helping others. Individual self-report exercises and an experiential group support session will assist the participants to assess their own level of stress through sharing personal experiences with others. **(\$220/\$330)**

ICISF: Crisis Informed Peer Para-Counseling *

Bell Buckle, TN – 31 Jul - 01 Aug, 8-5 both days

***Prerequisites: Ind. and Grp. Crisis Intervention**

Crisis Informed Peer Para-Counseling (CIPP) expands the support tools of peer counselors to collectively cope with trauma and disasters. CIPP will become the 1:1 follow up service to CISD. The unprecedented mix of unique stressors & disasters with limited psychological resources means at risk populations are seeking a strategic crisis response; one that holistically builds the resilience of those in need and expands the support tools of peer counselors to collectively cope with trauma. **(\$220/\$330)**

CISM: Grief Following Trauma

Bell Buckle, TN – 02-03 Aug, 8-5 both days

Emergency professionals will encounter traumatic death and loss issues personally and professionally. Professionals often feel ill prepared to provide effective care throughout the grief process. This course will cover key grief and loss concepts relating to trauma and traumatic death. Participants will increase their knowledge of how trauma impacts the grief process and will gain skills for evaluating and supporting persons who have experienced traumatic death and loss. **(\$220/\$330)**

Essentials of Emergency Service Chaplaincy *

Bell Buckle, TN – 02-03 Aug, 8-5 both days

***Prerequisites: NIMS 700, 800, 100 & 200**

This course provides the nationally recognized Federation of Fire Chaplains foundation for Fire/Rescue/EMS chaplain service and teaches an established and credentialed system of protocols in order to provide chaplaincy to emergency workers and the public. **(\$270/\$380)**

Emergency Service Peer Support Course Set

Jackson, TN – 16-19 September, 8-5 all 4 days

This course provides the four components of Peer Support Excellence: Individual Crisis Intervention; Mental Health First Aid; Suicide Prevention, Intervention and Post-vention; and Effective Referral. **(\$350 – meals and lodging are on your own)**

The Tennessee Federation of Fire Chaplains supports the ministries of volunteer and paid fire department, ambulance service, and rescue squad chaplains, and assists emergency service agencies in developing their chaplaincy programs.

The TFFC cooperates with the Federation of Fire Chaplains on a national level, providing automatic membership and networking with the addition of a state-wide certification and accountability system for chaplains.

The Federation offers programs that provide its members with educational opportunities in training conferences and materials.

The network of mutual support offered by the TFFC helps disseminate and share information with other chaplains.

Assistance is given to fire/EMS/rescue organizations to start or improve their chaplaincy programs.

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- TFFC has members all across the State.
 - TFFC is non-denominational, non-sectarian, with no compromise on individual convictions.

Benefits to Members

- Written materials designed to help chaplains implement and sustain effective programs.
- Four newsletters each year to keep chaplains current in their field.
- Educational opportunities offered to chaplains in annual conferences and regional meetings.
- A Fire Chaplain Directory provided to all members to provide a network of mutual support and information sharing.
- Provides standing in a professional organization. Certificates for completed training are provided.
- A training library of written, audio, and audiovisual materials is available to members.
- Chaplain identification provided through ID cards, membership certificates, arm patches, and vehicle decals.
- Provides outlines and programs for annual Memorial Services.

Benefits to Department

- Provides information on establishing a chaplaincy program.
- Gives chaplain training through conferences, lesson materials, and articles.
- Gives support and encouragement to the chaplain.
- Keeps the chaplain abreast of the latest programs and developments in the field.

Membership

Membership is open to those involved with the fire/EMS/rescue chaplaincy whether full-time career or volunteer.

Membership Qualifications

- Appointed to the chaplaincy by a fire/EMS/rescue service agency
 - Endorsement by their religious body for the ministry as a chaplain
 - Currently serving as an emergency service chaplain
 - \$100.00 annual dues

Chaplain Certification

The Tennessee Federation of Fire Chaplains certifies qualified chaplains for service with a “Standard of Care” recognized state-wide.

Qualifications for Certification

- Qualifications for membership above
- Ordination - or an approved plan of guidance providing clergy supervision for those chaplains without ordination
- Completion of 16 hour basic chaplain’s course provided by either the Tennessee or National Federation of Fire Chaplains
- Completion of Individual Crisis Intervention course provided by International Critical Incident Stress Foundation
- Familiarization with the appropriate emergency service through cross training
- Continuing Education of 16 hours/year

What Emergency Service Chaplains Do

Fire/EMS/Rescue chaplains may perform some or all of the following duties:

- Counsel emergency service workers *
 - Counsel family members of emergency service workers *
 - Visit sick and injured emergency service workers at home and in the hospital
 - Make death notifications
 - Provide assistance to victims of crisis
 - Teach emergency service workers in areas such as stress management, ethics, family life, and victim response.
 - Serve as part of a Critical Incident Management Team
 - Assist at the emergency scene
 - Serve as liaison with other clergy in the community
 - Provide for the spiritual needs of department members and their families
 - Offer prayers at special occasions such as recruit graduations and award ceremonies
 - Provide a listening ear
 - Coordinate and provide family services in the event of the serious injury or death of an emergency service worker
 - Serve as a ready resource for the chief or agency director
- * (only within the scope of their training)
