




Alan Crosby is a freelance local historian, editor and lecturer and is Chair of the Federation. He has published over 30 books and numerous articles, and is the main local history contributor to the BBC *Who Do You Think You Are? Magazine.* Alan is also editor of the *The Local Historian*.






Jack Southern is a lecturer in Public History at UCLAN focusing on the social and cultural history of the North of England. He has published on subjects related to the British textile industry and the legacy of industrial decline in Lancashire including *A stronghold of liberalism? The north-east Lancashire cotton weaving districts and the First World War.*in: Labour, British Radicalism and the First World War. Manchester University Press (MUP, 2018)

Nicholas Radburn is a Senior Lecturer at Lancaster University and a historian of the Atlantic World, with a particular focus on the Trans-Atlantic slave trade. His book *Traders in Men: Merchants and the Transformation of the Transatlantic Slave Trade*, (Yale University Press, 2023) won the 2024 James A. Rawley Prize in Atlantic History from the American Historical Association.





Jill Liddington is Honorary Research fellow at Leeds University and a historian of women's history. Her research interests include women's suffrage and she has published the book *One Hand Tied Behind Us: the rise of the women's suffrage movement* (co-author), (Virago Press 1978 & 1984). Jill has also published on the diaries of Anne Lister of Shipden Hall, made popular by the television series.
