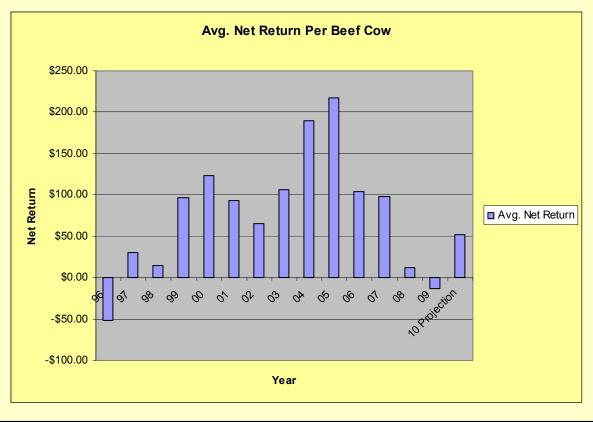




North Dakota State Beef Average Summary

Over the time frame in the above graph, the 20% most profitable ranches averaged over \$300 per cow more profit than the 20% least profitable ranches. The high profits ranches averaged \$224 per cow, the lowest profit averaged -\$86, and the average net was \$82 per cow.
