From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,

Having just celebrated the "National Day of Prayer" the idea of prayer is fresh on my mind. When ever you talk to someone about prayer there are several options that quickly come to mind that people use to answer the question of prayer.

We are called as followers of Christ to have an active prayer life. As to what constitutes activity in prayer is very subjective. We might have a morning devotion time that contains some prayer time, we might do our devotions at night before going to bed. For some it is a short sentence or two before eating a meal, if we are in a group setting.

I have heard quite a few say that they are too busy to pray. If that might be your answer then I suggest you read a book by Bill Hybels titled "*To Busy NOT to Pray.*" This book helps to establish and to maintain an active prayer life. One is drawn into the realization of how much we need prayer in our lives and in the lives and activities of the world around us.

Another book that I found very helpful is the one by Jim Cymbala titled "Fresh Wind, Fresh Fire. This book talks of the influence of the Holy Spirit in the life of the church and of the people. Mr. Cymbala is the lead pastor of the Brooklyn Tabernacle.

Either of these book would be a good read or even a study on prayer. If there is any interest we can do it as a group study or you can do it as an individual study.

I know that in the next couple of months there is a call for the churches to pray for direction as to the future of our Bishops and delegates as a special Conference has been called to consider the options presented by the Bishops in the "Way Forward".

One thing that must be stated there is only one wrong way to pray and that is in not praying. The simplest way to describe prayer is just to remember it is just a conversation with a friend. A way to share what is happening in our lives and in our souls. This then to grow into an open discussion with you talking and listening to where the Holy Spirit leads you.

If you need some motivation to prayer then just look at your hand. Use your fingers to lead you to prayer. Look at your thumb and consider this is the strongest digit on your hand. Give thanks for all the strong things in your life, like home, family, or relationships that support you. Then look at your index finger, this is the pointing finger. Pray for those people and things that guide and help you in your life. Next look at your middle finger, the tallest finger. Pray for all the people who have leadership positions in the world. Next comes the ring finger, the weakest of the fingers. Pray for those who are poor, the weak, the helpless, hungry, sick or in mourning. If there is a wedding or engagement ring on the finger remember to pray for your spouse or fiancée. Next is the little finger, the smallest and last finger on your hand. Use this to remember to pray for yourself.

There are several ways this prayer can be translated by the important thing to remember is that this is just a tool to start your prayer life. It is not the only way but just a way to begin to pray.



Ad Board Report

The Board notes, with great pleasure, the recent completion of the consolidation of the church's local bank accounts and the concomitant streamlining and simplification that it brings to the conduct of Bethany's routine financial business. Because of these measures, we will enjoy greatly increased efficiency in making payments, tracking income and expenses, reporting, and internal auditing.

We have been very successful in meeting our commitments to the newly expanded Milton Panther Packs program, lately delivering even more than we promised. The Panther Packs effort is now fully geared to the provision of nutritionally advantageous meals to the elementary students of the entire Milton rea School District, and our Share the Table ministry is also suitably expanded and accordingly repurposed to assist it. St. Andrew's UMC is coordinating the program, and is stockpiling what we donate now so that the kids' all-too-short summer vacations can be followed by new weekend food bags when school resumes.

Pastor Bill has been engaged to take part in Milton High School's June 3 baccalaureate ceremonies, and his wife Janet will conduct that evening's Worship in Praise, Prayer and Song service in his stead.

Trustees Report

A few years ago the Trustees considered replacing the entrance doors on Front Street. At that time we felt there were several other priorities which needed more immediate attention, so the door replacement project was put on the back burner. Recently, we were reminded that for many of our current parishioners and guests, it's difficult for them to navigate their way through the heavy doors. Therefore, at a recent meeting, the Trustees approved replacing the Front Street entrance doors. They chose The Baut Studios for the project, due to the fine work they did on refurbishing the stained glass windows, installing the protective glass, and the replacement of the Center Street entrance door. It's anticipated the doors will be installed in two to three months.

I'd like to take this opportunity to provide a quarterly report of the Trustees finances. The following balances (rounded) are as of March 31, 2018:

Note: All account values decreased due to downturn in the stock market during the first quarter of 2018.

- Hudock Capital Group \$682,333 a decrease of approximately \$8,900 from the end of the year –
 Although this is the account we've drawn from in the past for renovations, and to fund the deficit in current expenses, that was not necessary during the first quarter.
- Prudential Investments \$559,101 a decrease of approximately \$3,800 from the end of the year As stated in previous reports, this account was set up with an initial investment of \$500,000 in lieu of flood insurance, to repair any flood related damages we may have in the future.
- Prudential Investments \$84,322 The Radenbush Trust a decrease of approximately \$1,100 from the end of the year.
- Prudential Investments \$6,451 A decrease of approximately \$237 from the end of the year.
- BYN Mellon \$220,039 The Butler Trust a decrease of \$1,376 from the end of the year.
- Milton Savings Bank Enduring Memorial Fund This account was closed recently and the funds were transferred to the general checking account as part of the overall consolidation of accounts recently approved by the Ad Board.




