#### **Biography**

Victor A. Winkel, age 95 of Harbor Beach, passed away Tuesday, July 26, 2022 at McLaren Thumb Region. He was born on April 29, 1927 in Harbor Beach to the late Franz and Marie (Lull) Winkel. He grew up in Harbor Beach and graduated from Harbor Beach High School in 1944 at the age of 17. His favorite sport in school was basketball as he always talked about his hook shot, which he even demonstrated this great and great great nieces and nephews at his 95th birthday party this past April. Immediately after his graduation he began his career as a Merchant Seaman on board the Str. A.F. Harvey where he worked his first season on the great lakes, then went into Army Troops Transports for two and half years on Ocean Transports. From there he went back to the Great Lakes and sailed thru the 1963 season and had attained the position of 2nd mate on bulk freighters before leaving the Great Lakes He returned to Harbor Beach and started working at Dawes and then later G.D. Searles and NutraSweet. Victor was a huge source of information about Harbor Beach history and loved anything Maritime. The Winkel family tree was important to him as was his German Heritage. After his retirement, he enjoyed golfing and fishing in Harbor Beach, St. Helen and Dade City, Florida. He was a member of Zion Lutheran Church in Harbor Beach, he also attended Hope Lutheran Church in St. Helen. He was a former member of the St. Helen American Legion Post 416 and currently a member of the Harbor Beach American Legion Post 197 where he was their last World War II Veteran.
