BNC Fall Event Friday, October 11, 2019 Save the Date

Summer is almost over and we're busy working on interesting and informative programs for the coming year. BNC Phoenix has been very fortunate to obtain Josh Trachtenberg, Neuroscientist as our speaker for the Fall Event.

Josh Trachtenberg graduated from Brandeis in 1990 and is a leader in studying the living brain in action using advanced imaging

technology. After establishing his research laboratory at UCLA, he founded a company – Neurolabware – in order to build the sophisticated custom research microscopes that are needed to perform groundbreaking work in understanding how the brain develops and how diseases and injuries interrupt its normal functioning.

Due to your generosity, Brandeis University is in the process of acquiring one of these advanced microscopes that can observe fundamental processes. The two-photon microscope allows researchers to understand and see inside the living brain and observe the effect of illness.

In the past, the brain could only be studied upon death. The two-photon microscope has made it possible to study a disease while the patient is alive. The implications are unlimited.

Brandeis Happenings

Brandeis places 5th in Nature's global rankings

Nature, one of the most prestigious scientific journals, has ranked Brandeis 5th globally in its annual survey of institutions with the highest output of top-quality research in the natural sciences.

The journal described the top-tier institutions in the Nature Index Annual Table as "punching above their weight in producing high-quality research."

The rankings were calculated based on the share of articles published in 2018 by an institution's researchers in 82 prestigious scientific journals as a proportion of their overall output. This method, used for the first time this year, gives more recognition to schools with fewer faculty, but with a higher percentage publishing in premier journals.

Among the other institutions in the top five were the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, The Rockefeller University in New York and the Weizmann Institute of Science in Israel.
