

- 1. Measure the length around your finger. Add ½ inch (1 cm). This is the length of your cardboard piece. Then decide how slender or chunky you want your ring band. Cut a rectangle of cardboard in the dimensions you need.
- **2.** Paint both sides of your cardboard piece. Let dry.
- **3.** Brush decoupage glue over both sides of the cardboard piece, and let dry.
- **4.** Wrap the cardboard band around your finger to get a correct fit. Hot glue the ends together, overlapping enough to create a strong seam. Let dry.
- **5.** Use the compass to draw a 2-inch (5-cm) circle on decorative paper. Cut out the circle.
- **6.** Use the compass to lightly draw a $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch (1-cm) circle in the center of the paper circle.
- **7.** Cut the outside edge of the circle in strips, stopping at the center circle. Bend up every other strip slightly to create two layers of petals.
- 8. Hot glue a bead in the center of the flower.
- **9.** Hot glue the flower to the ring.
- **10.** Follow the directions on the can to spray the ring and flower with sealant. Let dry.



Tip: For the cardboard, try coffee cup sleeves or look for decorative border rolls found in craft, party, and teacher supply stores.

Materials:

tape measure

single-ply cardboard

small paint brushes

acrylic paints

decoupage glue

hot glue

math compass

decorative paper

1 bead

clear acrylic gloss coating sealant
