Tips for Keeping Your Property Safe

While our neighborhood is a wonderful place to live, that does not mean there is not crime. To help protect your property, here are some helpful tips.:

- * Anytime you are not home, make sure you lock the doors to your home. Most burglaries happen during broad daylight when everyone is at work.
- * Another thing you can do is leave a TV on when you're not home, so that you give the appearance of someone being home.
- *At night make sure you lock your car doors and do not leave valuables in your vehicle. If you do leave valuables in your car, place them in your trunk where they are out of sight. Glove boxes and center consoles are car prowlers number one spots to check.
- * If you do become a victim of a car prowl, check the surrounding bushes on your block. Car prowlers tend to stash the items they take in bushes and come back for them later.
- * Finally, turn your outdoor lights on at night and leave them on until the morning. This extra light is a deterrent to car prowlers.

We all want to believe that this won't happen in our neighborhood, but the reality is these things do happen and it is our responsibility to safe guard our own property.

Architectural Changes

Please remember that making visible changes to your home or property might require Board approval. This includes exterior paint, major structural changes to the interior, etc. If you're planning any projects, please take a moment to review the Architectural Change requirements detailed in the CC&Rs. This can be found under Article C. An Architectural Change Request Form is available on the HOA's website, or can be requested by contacting a member of the Board. We do our best to respond promptly.

Landscaping on 53rd – Update

At the end of February, the first set of trees were cut down by the City of Albany. This Fall they will be grinding up the roots and planting new trees. We anticipate that around the same time, the sections of sidewalks next to those trees will be leveled.

We know that some of the arborvitae and nearby plants have been affected by weather conditions over the past few years. We are working with our new landscaper, American Landscaping, to create a plan to replace those plants with options that are better suited to the conditions.
