Scubber




The "Scubber" is a Sculpin variation created by Jonathan Kiley at <u>FlySkinz.com</u>. This fly uses the small size Fish Finz and could be fished dead drift or as a normal streamer. Please have a look at the video for the Scubber at <u>FlySkinz.com</u>.

Scubber Recipe

Hook: TMC300 Size 6 or 8
Thread: Match Thread Color to Body Color. In our case we will be using UTC 140 in Dark Brown
Tail: Kiley's Small Fish Finz Mottled Rust
RIB: Medium Hot Orange Wire
Body1: STS Trilobal Dub – Brown Stone
Body2: Pine Squirrel Zonker - Brown
Fins: Kiley's Small Fish Finz Mottled Rust
Head: Sculpin Mini Head - Brown

1. Start by attaching the thread to the hook at the Hook point with a jam knot



2. Dub a small ball at the bend of the hook. This will provide the Tail Finz a place to rest against.




3. Tie in the Tail Finz



4. Tie in the Medium Orange wire for the Rib.



5. Dub a body to the 50-60% point using the Trilobal Brown Stone Dubbing.



6. Flip the hook over in the vise or if your using a rotary turn the hook over.



7. Tie in the Over body of Squirrel Zonker. The length is to the hook point.



8. Wrap the rib forward – Just one of two wraps. We will use the rib to secure the Squirrel Zonker.



9. Use some Glue (Super Glue or Gorilla Glue) on the bottom of the Squirrel to secure it to the dubbing.



10. Push the Squirrel Zonker down onto the dubbing and then wrap the medium Hot Orange wire through the squirrel to secure it to the hook. Tie off the wire and then helicopter the wire to break it off.



11. Attach the Fish Finz.



12. Dub forward to the hook eye with the Trilobal Brown Stone dubbing.



13. Whip finish

14. Put some super glue around the dubbing at the hook eye and then push the Sculpin Helmet over the hook eye. You could also add some Loon UV under the helmet for extra holding,



15. Put the eyes on and your all done with the Scubber!
