They had to work together and cooperate to help each other fill the bottles with "snow". Teamwork is such an important part of Room 221 and the children are rocking it!


















feels, and what happens when ice melts. The children participated in a science experiment, using salt and warm water to melt ice to rescue the animals frozen in ice.



















Student Spotlight




planes, and anything that flies. from McDonald's if one is offered! But most of all, he loves making new friends!

















Little Villager Attends Islanders Game
