The Reverend's Ruminations - June 2025

Well, as of a couple weeks ago, Ellen and I have new titles: Grandma & Grandpa to two identically-handsome little boys! It's hard for us to believe that we're old enough to hold such status, but as many of you have probably said before: "ready or not, here we go!" As of this writing, Emerson & Jamison are making very good progress for having arrived at about 33 weeks, but will still be in the hospital a little while longer to ensure that they are strong enough to go home without any assistance. Jamis was able to return from his deployment in Iraq just ahead of the big event, and will be able to resume work at Ft. Campbell after several weeks of paternity leave instead of returning overseas. Emma is recovering well from the extended birthing process and looking forward to bringing their little bundles of joy home to begin the parenthood adventure very soon.





Just two weeks prior, we were excited to join Cameron and his fiancé, Bella, as they graduated from college together, so we're also now more officially "empty nesters." Both events symbolize big changes in the lives of our family, but whether it is the birth of a new child, a downsizing of homes, a funeral, a graduation, or (like many others this time of year) the end of another school year, CHANGE is a constant in life. As always, our worship services are also available live or later through the **BoxCast** button on our church website (*fairmontucc.org*), on our **Facebook** page (*facebook.com/firstcongofairmontmn*), or through your own <u>free</u> **rightnow** MEDIA account. We're also on **Fairmont cable access channel 12** on Thursday afternoons at 2:00 if you're back in town during the week.


Moving through June and into the church season "after Pentecost" (also known as "Ordinary Time"), our Sunday lectionary scripture readings will be from the **Gospel of John** (chapters 17, 14, & 16) for the first three weeks before changing to the **Gospel of Luke** for an extended journey that will take us all the way to the end of November. The epistle readings will examine brief sections of Paul's Letters to the Romans, Galatians, and Colossians, while my sermons will return to the Old Testament — specifically Proverbs and First and Second Kings during the month of June.

As we enter "unofficially" into Minnesota's all-too-fleeting summer months, I pray that they will nonetheless provide opportunity for rest, relaxation, family time, and perhaps a new commitment to worship God together at First Congregational United Church of Christ!

Also in attendance: Dean Grotte, Ace Adams.

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 5:45 PM. Moderator Kay Campe called the meeting to order, and Catherine Johnson led in prayer.

Motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on 4/16/25 was M/S/C. (Amanda Forstrom/ Larry Lasch)

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cory provided a printed report of his work this past month. He is away meeting his new grandsons who were born unexpectedly prematurely.

Treasurer's Report: We received a pledge of a mutual fund stock. The Bylaws state that it should be sold and reinvested. Since this is a fund we already use in our invested reserves, Catherine Johnson moved that we hold this fund, rather than sell it only to repurchase it. M/S/C (Catherine Johnson/ Amanda Forstrom). Catherine gave notice that she will complete her role as Treasurer at the end of January 2026.

A motion to receive the treasurer's report was M/S/C. (Larry Lasch/Sue Kruse)

BOARD REPORTS:

Christian Education: No report. The end of Sunday School bowling party was a success.

Missions: Hosting Community Meal in May. The June blessing box will be for Shepherd's Inn. Meals on Wheels went well. Thanks to all who helped.

Diaconate: Sending cards out.

Hospitality: On track for Interlaken Heritage Days Pie Social Fundraiser.

Facilities: Will begin to do utility bill tracking.

Worship: A Military-style Field service worship service will be June 15. Our joint service with St. Johns will be on June 22, at Lincoln Park.

NEW BUSINESS:

-Motion to approve Pastor Cory being gone Sunday, May 25 was M/S/C. (Larry Lasch/ Amanda Forstrom)

-Ace Adams presented ideas about increasing our churches mission involvement. There are opportunities and resources available within the UCC. After discussion, it was decided to move forward with an exploratory committee around the topic of Creation Justice.

-Investment Advisory Task Force – There was extensive discussion about the goals and logistics of our invested reserves. A motion that we form a task force to further discuss and develop guidelines was M/S/C. (Catherine Johnson/ Larry Lasch) Volunteers will be recruited.

-The accessible entrance on the lower level has been repaired and improved. With the cooperation of the City, the divot in the alley has been improved. <u>Many thanks</u> to Dean Grotte and Grotte Construction for the quick work! A motion was M/S/C to ratify the electronic vote taken on the project. (Kay Campe/ Catherine Johnson)

-Phillips Family donations: The Phillips family has proposed donating the contents of the house as a donation to the church. Discussion was held about how to manage the logistics of this. Dean Grotte will explore and coordinate these efforts with Jim Phillips.

Participating in organizations involved with Downtown Plaza. A motion was M/S/C to join the Greater Downtown Plaza Association (\$250) and to participate in the Project 1590 planter beautification (\$250). (Larry Lasch / Sue Kruse)
Building use: Two organizations have asked to use the building. The request by Adult Mental Health Counseling was referred to Pastor Cory for more information.

REM requests to hold a Silver Sneakers style exercise class for clients with disabilities 2 times a month. A motion was M/S/C to allow this for a 6-month trial. (Amanda Forstrom/ Carol Barrick)

Moderator Kay Campe adjourned the meeting.
