Please come and participate in the flag retirement service scheduled to follow the 9am worship service on **June 10th**.





Some History: Christianity and Nursing

The history of nursing first becomes continuous with the beginning of Christianity. Pre-Christian records are fragmentary and scattered; however, records of nursing from the early days of Christian workers to the present day are continuous. Christ's teachings of love and brotherhood transformed not only society at large but also the development of nursing. "Organised nursing" was a direct response to these teachings and epitomized the concept of pure altruism initiated by the early Christians. The practical test of the new faith was "not to be ministered to, but to minister". This rule later often appeared on the seats of benches in hospitals. Service to others was an avowed duty of all Christian men and women.

The entry of women into nursing after 300 AD was affected by at least


