A THANKSGIVING PRAYER

If you were not in church for either of the morning services on Sunday, October 19th, you missed the closing sermon of our recent Terra Incognita series. I would like to share a bit of that sermon with you. If you WERE in church that morning...it's worth the "repeat"!

"As a congregation, we stand on a threshold. Behind us is what was, before us...what could be. And we stand right here...in the doorway...making a decision. Every church I've served has reached this moment. They haven't all made the same decision. And based on my experience, here's the reality- if we stand in the doorway too long, or if we openly turn and head BACK the way we came...then we are saying we like things just the way they are. We don't want to be any more than we are right this moment. We are choosing status quo. And if that happens, there are two realities that grow out of that: 1. We will NOT stand still, but instead slide backward. There is NO standing still in the life of a congregation. There is only moving forward or sliding backward. 2. Once that die is cast, it will be at least 10-15 years before this church will get another shot at the brass ring. At least.

That's the downside. BUT...there IS an upside. If we choose instead to step out in faith and step THROUGH the doorway, move forward...oh my! Amazing things can happen! The things that have happened in the last few years that have enabled this congregation to better reach more people for Jesus Christ? As awesome as they are, they will pale in comparison to what could be.

Who do we want to be? Do we want to keep our cards close to our vests, play it safe and not rock the boat? If that's our choice, then we can continue to do good ministry and be a beacon in the community. Or do we want to step boldly out of the boat, knowing that, if and only if we keep our eyes firmly fixed on Jesus Christ, we...can...walk...on...water? If there's one thing the past 18 months of tumors the size of golf balls and life-threatening surgeries has taught me, it is that I simply cannot waste one more day. Life is TOO short. Life is TOO precious. If you are willing to take this journey with me, then let's do this thing. I am saying, right here and right now, in front of God and everybody, that I'm pushing all of my chips...ALL of them...into the center of the table. I am ALL in. For me, it's "pedal to the metal", "damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead". What about you? Will you join me? If so, then let's buckle up and get ready to enjoy the ride!

CURRENT SERMON SERIES(ES)!

On October 26th, we began two NEW sermon series! First, for Sunday mornings, we began **Growing Spiritual Redwoods**. This series, based on a book by Bill Easum and Tom Bandy, looks at the two types of churches that exist today--those that are withering and those that are flourishing. We started from the premise that "the way we've always done it" keeps churches from ministering to its members. Putting aside decision-makers for disciple-makers is one of the facets of change that can alter the leadership, worship, and methodology of any church, lending itself to further growth, evangelism, and outreach. This series will help us answer the kinds of questions that confront Christians in this era of rapid and uncertain change. Questions like: are you committed to Jesus Christ...or to a particular doctrine? Do you speak of faith as an experience of Christ...or as a heritage to protect at all costs? Do you believe that the purpose of ministry is to make members...or disciples? Deep spiritual vitality and an openness to the "new thing" that God is doing characterize the "spiritual redwoods" that can emerge from this time of change. The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

- **Sunday, November 2- Vista Two: Beneath, Behind, Beyond** (Luke 10:25-28)
Passion for the transforming experience of Jesus and the mystery of life brings hope, harmony and joy. (Deuteronomy 3:4-6, John 13:34-35)
- **Sunday, November 9- Vista Three: The Fluid That Flows** (Matthew 4:8-11)
Worship feeds new life in multiple ways and is indigenous to the cultural forest surrounding the Spiritual Redwood. (Psalm 95:6-7a, Romans 12:1-2)
- **Sunday, November 16- Vista Four: Birthing the Fruits of Life** (2Corinthians 5:14-18)
Spiritual leadership helps others give birth to the potential which God has created in every person. (Ezekiel 11:19-20, 1John 1:7-9)
- **Sunday, November 23- Vista Five: The Tree of Life** (Revelation 22:1-6)
The best vision of growth is seen from the tallest of trees. (Proverbs 29:18, Acts 18:9-11)

Also on October 26, we began our next Sunday EVENING sermon series- **Burning Heart: The Unmistakable Fire**. In 2006, heart disease caused 26% of ALL deaths in the United States. It is the leading cause of death for both men and women. In 2009, heart disease cost the United States \$304.6 billion, including the cost of health care services, medications, and lost productivity. Our heart is an incredibly vital organ. And it's NOT just vital from a physical standpoint- it is also central to our spiritual growth. As we walk through the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy, we are experiencing the journey the heart takes as it moves from being lost to being on fire for God. Where will you find YOURSELF on the journey? The remaining weeks of this series look like this:

- **Sunday, November 2- The Turned Heart** (Deuteronomy 29:16-18)
Are YOU responsible when a fellow Christian turns away from God?
- **Sunday, November 9- The Disciplined Heart** (Deuteronomy 8:1-5)
How does God provide for you?
- **Sunday, November 16- The Giving Heart** (Deuteronomy 15:7-11)
Why does God want you to help others?
- **Sunday, November 23- The Burning Heart** (Deuteronomy 6:3-6)
Do you love God with all your heart?

God's Word has the capacity to change people no matter what the human motivation or program might be. Come to worship each Sunday- expecting God to show up and grow you into a spiritual redwood AND to see what He can do...and wants to do...with your heart!

This year at Thanksgiving, we pray you will be able to break bread with family and/or friends. This Thanksgiving, take time to count your blessings- name them one by one. This Thanksgiving, be sure to give God the thanks He deserves for all of the blessings He gives us.

GO & TELL...3 REASONS

It's amazing as Christians how easy it is for us to get wrapped up in our own lives. We spend so much time thinking about whom we should date, what we should wear and all the drama going on at school that we forget to focus on telling people about Jesus.

Jesus said do it.

Some of Jesus' last words were telling His disciples to share the Gospel with others. If Jesus tells us we should do something, then we should do it!

Mark 16:15 – And then he told them, "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone. (NLT)

Jesus instructed us to tell the Good News to everyone. So we should be doing it!

If you don't, they might go to hell.

This should be enough of a reason by itself to tell others about Jesus. If you don't tell the people in your life about Jesus, they might die and go to hell. And hell isn't that great. So be sure to look for opportunities to tell others about Jesus. You could get the chance to save someone from going to hell!



The Beatitudes: Developing Spiritual Character

CALL-EM-ALL



By now, you've probably noticed that the parking area on 3rd Street just outside the Church Office has been re-painted. The goals that the Trustees have for that area are:

1. to offer two spots (all the way to the west) that are reserved for vehicles that have lifts which need extra space to load and unload
2. to offer a few parking spots that are designated for people who need to park as close as possible.

The nine spots in that stretch that are to the east ARE marked (on the pavement) as "handicapped" spots. They are, however, not "legal" handicapped spots, due to space requirements. Therefore, what the Trustees ask is that, if you HAVE a handicapped parking designation for your vehicle OR you simply need to park that close...please park there! On the other hand, if you are able/comfortable to park across the street and walk over, then please save the other spots for folks who need them! Parking is CERTAINLY a problem here at AUMC- and what a GREAT problem to have!




