Roser's Reflection . . .

Dear Friends,

When I conducted a survey of our members to determine a meeting time for a monthly book club during the winter months, I discovered two important things:

The majority of our members who attend our weekly Bible class are not inclined to join a book club. There is nothing wrong with this as they are two very different activities and it is unreasonable to expect that every member will want to participate in everything we offer. If we are to serve a diverse community we need to offer learning opportunities that speak to a variety of needs and interests.

A number of our members would like to participate in a book club here at St. John's, but their schedules make it very difficult for them to attend a physical meeting at the church.

To that end, Bible class will return to our weekly schedule after Easter (hopefully winter will be over by then) and we will launch an online book club in January. Since the book club will primarily include those who are unable to attend our Bible class, it will be a year-round club rather than one which meets only during the winter months. I am excited to offer this learning opportunity as a way of nurturing the discipleship of more of our members, especially those whom we are not currently serving as fully as I would like.

The book club will occur within a private group on Facebook called "St. John's Online Book Club" [pretty clever, isn't it?] You can reach the site by going to https://www.facebook.com/groups/955846788127886 and then clicking on the blue button which reads "+ Join Group." You are also encouraged to invite your friends to join us!

During the next several months, we will be exploring the following titles from our publishing house:

Jan/Feb 2020 - Thank, Praise, Serve, and Obey: Recover the Joys of Piety by William Weedon

Mar 2020 - 5 Things You Can Do to Have a Faithful Prayer Life by Robert Hiller

Apr/May 2020 - How to Read the Bible with Understanding by Lane Burgland

Jun/Jul 2020 - Hope When Your Heart Breaks: Navigating Grief and Loss, by Michael Newman

Members are invited to join in for reading all of the books or certain ones that catch their interest. Joining the group does not obligate one to read every book that we examine. Additionally, one does not need to comment within the Facebook group discussions in order to be a full participant of the group. While we would love to have everyone's input, reading the book and following the discussions as they unfold will be just as beneficial for those who would rather not comment. In fact, parishioners are often surprised that when we attend a meeting or learning opportunity outside of our congregation that I rarely offer any comments. My preferred learning style is to listen to others and absorb what is being shared. At St. John's, where I have been called to be a teacher of God's Word it is my responsibility to offer my commentary. The point that I want to make is that no one will judge anyone else for the number of their online interactions within our group.






Annual Voters' Meeting
