Wednesday and Sunday Study

We have just one more class before we will have completed our study of the Acts of the Apostles. We have been focusing on Paul these past few weeks. Our total of 20 people is still holding and everyone is enjoying the class. We have lots of questions which is good and everyone says they are learning a lot. This week we went to Rome with Paul and long the way we were shipwrecked on Malta. Luckily, there was another grain ship from Alexandria in port so Paul, Luke, the Centurion Julius and many other people could take that ship close to Rome then walk the rest of the way on the Appian Way. The biggest reason why they shipwrecked was that they were sailing on the Mediterranean during the "wrong"

time of the year. The safest time to sail the Mediterranean was May through September when the skies were clear. From October to March, the skies were normally overcast making it impossible to use a Sexton to navigate. Paul's ship was out there in October but would have probably been alright had they not gotten hit by a huge storm that lasted for two weeks and pushed them way off course. They got hung up on a sandbar approaching Malta and the ship went down. Everyone was saved, however. We also started learning about the Epistles Paul wrote to give inspiration and help to the early churches he had helped to "plant".

At our last class, we will complete our study of the Epistles then find out what happened to "the boys" after Acts. Some of the Apostles are never heard from again, but some we do know some things about. Some things are facts but many are traditions or legends. Either way, we will find out what there is to find.





News from Fort Dauphin and the Friends



of Toliara

The November 8 "Friends of Toliara" newsletter was dedicated to the "Rooted in Jesus" visit and training sessions at the Cathedral complex.

Rooted in Jesus is a group course in Christian discipleship written specifically for use in Africa. It is the only material of its kind written especially for the use of ordinary African Christians, rather than translated from material developed for

people who face different problems and challenges in their Christian lives (read cyclones, drought, poverty, etc.).

It was created in 2002 as part of a link relationship between the Diocese of Leicester and the Diocese of Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania. From 2002 to now, it has been introduced to over 90 dioceses in 18 African countries and translated into many different languages, Malagasy being one of them. There are over 100,000 people meeting in Rooted in Jesus groups across Africa.

The groups are lead by pastors, evangelists, catechists or newly commissioned lay leaders all both men and women. Many of the groups have seen people becoming Christians, experiencing answered prayers, deepening their commitment to one another and to the church and living changed lives.

It is an interactive and practical course with an emphasis on the active participation of each member through the empowering presence of the Holy Spirit.

Interestingly enough, only the leader needs to know how to read and write since the material is practiced orally. There is also a Rooted in Jesus Junior course for use in Sunday School.

A small Rooted in Jesus team went to Toliara in October after not having been there for 12 years since they had originally brought the material to the six dioceses of Madagascar. Many things had happened over that timeframe including Covid and cyclones, especially Freddy but more importantly the number of churches that had been planted. The team was amazed at how awesome the people were doing.

The meetings were attended by 80 clergy and lay leaders including 15 Rooted in Jesus Junior leaders. All these groups were meeting where ever they could: under a tree, in people's homes, in the church, in a field. The report said that the program was especially strong in Fort Dauphin. When they came together for the conference, the members all had Rooted in Jesus t-shirts and the 3 youngest members (13, 14, 15) had completed the Junior program and wanted to train to lead the groups themselves. (I am going to find out if any of these three are "Our Kids". Wouldn't that be something!!!)

Bishop Samy and Venerable Canon Donne were both in attendance. Bishop Samy has set a target of groups in each parish of at least 30 people. Like I keep saying, they are really all fired up for Christ!!!!

Ven. Donne and his family own a printing business and he and his wife, Vero, printed all the material and Rooted in Jesus books for the conference. I know Donne was pretty tired after the conference!!!! He worked hard. Just a reminder, he was the town drunk when Todd McGreggor first met him and brought Jesus to him.

Brace yourselves my fellow fabric washers, I have four boxes of bolts of fabric needing to be washed and ironed. Knowing that the Spaghetti Dinner was coming, I have not brought them in for volunteers to take yet. That will be changing in the next week. Hopefully you will take a bolt or two. I was talking to Betsy, the scoutmaster, about this because she has taken fabric before. She had the idea that the scouts could learn the fine art of ironing by helping us out with washing and ironing. I don't know if that will actually happen but it might be a good idea. Everyone should know how to iron!!!!
