- 1. Old Business: Selectwoman Cyr wanted to clarify that when the genetics lab did not build on the Neck Road it was due to no sewer line. * The Genetic Lab did not go in because of no access to the sewer lines and was not due the fault of Gary Dixon, It was the lack of communication between all the town boards.
- 2. <u>Transfer Station</u>: The Select board discussed the possibility of roadside pickup of trash. Also discussed was the Thursday night meeting with the Selectman of Clinton. Selectwoman Cyr will present a new contract that will discuss: possible options as follows: Fee for service, contract including a termination clause that is mutual, and also a liability clause. Selectman Dixon made a motion. Selectwoman Patterson seconded on Selectwoman Cyr's updated changes to contract with Attorney Bill Lee agreeing with said changes to the contract. All in favor.
- 3. <u>Tempesta Hearing</u>: Selectman Dixon asked about the hearing and if any news had been heard. Currently it is the same.
- 4. **LED Lighting**: LED light contract was signed for the LED upgrade to the street lights.
- 5. **Pump Station**: A timeline was presented by Selectwoman Cyr. The foundation was to begin the end of June, first week in July. Concrete would follow the 2nd week of July and the building construction would take place in the end of July through August. The pumps came in under cost and that it would take 8 to 12 weeks to be delivered.
- 6. <u>Election Results:</u> Election results will be posted on the door of the office. They will also be posted on Facebook and the Town's website.
- 7. <u>Alewife Festival:</u> The festival was successful with new directors Dwight and Amy Gagnon.
- 8. <u>Adjournment</u>: Selectman Dixon motioned to adjourn at 7:15 p.m. with Selectwoman Patterson seconding. All in favor.
