From the Pastor's Study

Dear Friends,

Have you ever attended a book signing or "meet the author" event?

I love to see "book signings" when I am perusing bookstores. I always walk over to that general area - not so close that I feel obli-

gated to purchase the author's book, but close enough to see people interacting with the author. It's fun to see people who have actually read the books getting the rare opportunity to speak with the author. If we think about it, reading always involves a dialogue between the author and reader even though it typically only takes place in our minds. After having engaged with the author in the course of reading their books, it is an amazing thing to be able to meet them in person.

My favorite author - outside of nonfiction titles - is Charles Dickens. While it has been a while since he was available for book signings, he has taught me so much about what it means to be human and to live in a fallen world. Every time I read one of his novels - and yes, they are quite long and dusty [I trust that you and I also are engaged in a dialog as you read this] - Dickens challenges me to acknowledge the power of sin over this world and the depths of human misery.

A couple of months ago, I had the opportunity to meet the author of a book that impacted me deeply. His name is John Schmidtke [you're right, the Schmidtke's are from Sheboygan] who is the pastor of Bethlehem Lutheran Church in St. Louis. His book, *A Place Not Forgotten*, was recommended to me by a friend. In the early pages of the book, he dedicates an entire essay to "transiency." You probably know that my greatest joy in ministry is teaching children about Jesus who has died to save them.


You may not know that the deepest pain I endure in ministry is when children whom we have connected with move. On my worst days, I sometimes feel like Beloit is where you live before you move to Rockford or Chicago. That's not true but is a part of how I cope when children tell me "we're moving to Rockford" or "we're moving to Chicago." John's essay on "transiency" hit me hard because he acknowledged my pain while challenging me to see the work of God in the seeds we have planted in young souls that will go onto be watered by other churches in Rockford and Chicago.

To make a long story a bit more bearable, I'll get to the point. We have put A Place Not Forgotten into the hands of our members who serve on council and our boards. We also want to make it available to anyone else who would like to read it. If you don't have the book and would like to read it - please tell me and I will get you a copy ASAP.

On Wednesday, July 7, at 5:30 pm, we are having our own "meet the author" event in our church sanctuary. That's right, Pastor Schmidtke will be with us in-person to talk about neighborhood ministry and to answer questions that you may have. I hope that you will join us whether you have read the book or not. Again, if you would like to read the book and you do not have a copy, please tell me and I will get one for you!

As most of you already know, Pastor Roser recently read the book *A Place Not Forgotten* by Pastor John Schmidtke of St. Louis, and has found great inspiration within it. 


