Grade 3 News

We will learn what causes weather and how weather can be predicted. Math- students have started a section on the writing of algebraic expressions and their utility in solving word problems.

Social Studies, we are starting to finish up our studies on Egypt before moving on to China.

Grade 7 News

Skills-The The students just took their unit 4 test. We are currently working on unit 5 now and will have a test before Christmas break. Their progressive reports will reflect the grade they receive on the unit 4 test. Science-In science, the students are learning about how traits are inherited. We have been focusing on the Punnett square. During December the students will work on making DNA models and extracting DNA from a fruit. Math class will be introduced to equations and inequalities and the methods by which they are solved. **Religion** class is beginning a unit focused on the first Person of the Blessed Trinity.

Social Studies, we are examining the similarities and the differences between the 13 colonies.

Literature, we are reading The Witch of Blackbird Pond. Ask your child to describe Hannah.

Grade 8

Skills-The The students just took their unit 4 test. We are currently working on unit 5 now and will have a test before Christmas break. Their progressive reports will reflect the grade they receive on unit 3 and 4 tests.

Science- Thus far in our STEAM unit the students made bath fizzes. We are currently working on building a bridge out of popsicle sticks the can support two textbooks on it.

Math class has been working with equations and solving them using

integers and will be moving on to solving multi-step equations. In **Religion**, the class has recently finished a study of the Ten Commandments and will then will start a unit on Church history. **Social Studies**, we will be looking at the causes of the Civil War. **Literature**, we are reading Little Women.
