# JEFF AND MACKENZIE BEZOS PLEDGE \$2 BILLION FOR HOMELESS AND PRESCHOOLERS

The Amazon founder and chief executive, Jeff Bezos, and his wife, Mackenzie, pledged \$2 billion on Thursday for a new fund to start preschools and help homeless families.

The money, put into what he called the Day 1 Fund, is by far the largest philanthropic donation by Mr. Bezos, the world's richest person. It will support organizations that provide shelter and food for homeless families, and will start a network of nonprofit Montessori-inspired preschools for underserved communities.

"If our own greatgrandchildren don't have lives better than ours, something has gone very wrong," As Mr. Bezos's wealth and influence has grown, he has faced increased public pressure to make significant philanthropic investments. His net worth is valued at \$164 billion, according to the Bloomberg Billionaires Index. He bought The Washington Post in 2013 for \$250 million, and has said he's put about \$1 billion a year into his private spaceflight company, Blue Origin.

His largest known philanthropic contribution to date was \$33 million in scholarships to support the education of undocumented students who graduated from high school in the United States. Earlier this month, he made his first major political contribution, putting \$10 million into a bipartisan political action committee to support military veterans running for Congress.

The fund's homeless work will involve "annual leadership awards" to groups doing "compassionate, needlemoving work to provide shelter and hunger support to address the immediate needs of young families," Mr. Bezos said. He cited Mary's Place, a nonprofit in the Seattle area that Amazon has worked with in recent years, as inspiration.

# **CRIMES COMMITTED BY THE HOMELESS**

While most crimes committed by homeless people fall into the non-arrest, misdemeanor category, some violent acts are on the rise as well.

In a recently released report, groping and unwanted touching crimes by homeless people riding the subway have seen an 8 percent increase.

Assaults by the homeless are up 10 percent.

Nearly 30% admitted to committing a "minor crime such as shoplifting or antisocial behavior" in the hope of being taken into custody for the night. And a fifth of those questioned said they had avoided being given bail or committed "an imprisonable offence with the express purpose of receiving a custodial sentence as a means to resolving their housing problems"

"I love y'all, thank y'all so much. I just want to tell y'all that from the bottom of my heart," said Speaks.

Speaks says right now he's focused on going to college and playing football when his senior year wraps up.

Besides the increase in the number of homeless people on the street, mental illness and addiction problems are also listed as major contributors to crimes committed by the homeless. Some recent high profile crimes committed by a few that are homeless has now shown a big spotlight on the issue. The question that some homeless advocates are asking is will those individual that are mentally ill be given the same due process.

The issue can be a lot deeper. Take the current case of Collen Richard Daniel 22, who has been charged with 1st degree murder in the death of Celia Barquin Arozamena, a student at Iowa State University. An acquaintance of Richards told investigators that the suspect had said in recent days that he had "an urge to rape and kill a woman" while they were walking on a trail near the course, the complaint said.

The argument will be premeditated murder or someone with a mental illness. Only time will tell how this issue works out.



#### ON A MISSION: MISSISSIPPI TEEN STARTS MINISTRY TO GIVE SOCKS TO HOMELESS

Socks are the No. 1 most requested clothing item at homeless shelters. This is a fact Carver O'Neal read last year, and it resonated with him. "It's one of the things they just don't really receive a lot of," said the 16-yearold. "Scripture says, 'Pray without ceasing. Pray continuously,' so I really try to put that into practice in my life. When this started, I felt the Lord leading me there,

#### and I kept praying."

O'Neal, a student at Pillow Academy, said he was in class one day and an idea for a sock drive hit him.

"After I saw that fact, and for me there's certain times you keep praying about something and God is just going to let you know, and I think that's kind of how it was. He just let me know that was the thing," said O'Neal. "It did involve a lot of prayer." So last year O'Neal held a sock drivee and collected 665 pairs of socks," he said. The successful event sparked O'Neal to continue the work he felt led to do. This year, the 10th-grader formed Mission: Socks, a ministry dedicated to providing the homeless with socks.
