### FROM THE EAST

Thank you to all who were able to make it to our March Stated Communication. We had the honor of hosting our DDGM's Official Visit. RWor. Michael Paul Bible gave a most memorable and informative presentation consisting of fraternal greetings from the Grand Master of Masons in Virginia, the Grand Master's and DDGM's plans and vision for the year, and happenings in the District and the Commonwealth. In addition to a fantastic Stated, we once again must give a huge "shout out" to the OES for preparing yet another phenomenal dinner consisting of corned beef and cabbage and shepherds pie. Yum. Listen, if you can't come out for Stated, at least come to dinner! They have been great. Well, I am kidding about just coming out for dinner. We really want to see as many brethren as we can. You won't be disappointed!

Congratulations to our ELT54's newest affiliated member, Raymond Vance Kasey! We thought he was already a member with as much as he has done for and with the Lodge. It's just official now!

Regrettably, I have vacated the position of Marshal and OES Ambassador for a myriad of reasons. It was not an easy decision, but a necessary decision. I would like to know if anyone among you are open and willing to serving in either of these very important roles. The Marshal serves as a coordinator for public ceremonies, provides readings on topics of relevance to the Craft at Stated Communications, and assists with Masonic funerals. The OES Ambassador simply acts as a liaison with Faith Chapter OES. Please consider the roles and let me know soonest if you are interested.

I am very excited to report that, in keeping with my theme of charity, the Lodge voted to sponsor a hole for the Ian McLaurin Shipley, Jr. Golf Tournament, which will take place on April 18<sup>th</sup> in the amount of \$1,000.00. Many thanks to the Timberman Temple Corporation (TTC) who matched our support of \$500.00. The proceeds from the tourney will directly benefit the Grand Lodge of Virginia's college scholarship fund.

As you may recall, the TTC was reconstituted and set on a fresh, new path with clear direction. I am happy to report the new and improved TTC is on to a great start, with some fantastic energy. Thank you to the Board for your hard work, as already demonstrated this early in the year. The new President, Bro. Robert Pacific, shared a lot of information at the March Stated. I will give you the wave tops here:

- RWor. Shroeder requested to resign as Secretary. The Board approved the resignation and elected Bro. Robert Rainey as the new Secretary. Many thanks to RWor. Shroeder for his many prior years of service as the TTC's Secretary.
- The TTC received a copy of the Articles of Incorporation and found that we overcorrected when reconstituting the Board. The Stationed Officers of the Lodge are automatically members of the Board. As such, 3 of the newly elected Board members had to be removed due to no fault of their own. The Board recommended RWor. Shroeder, RWor. Riley, and WBro. Coldren be removed from the Board to bring it back to seven, which the Lodge voted on and concurred with.
- The TTC is donating new Lodge officer aprons, collars, and jewels to ETL. The custom items have been purchased and will hopefully be on station by April Stated.
- The TTC is working on several capital improvements to the building such as replacement of the lower level HVAC and rehab of the lodge room to include wainscotting, painting, new benches, and new carpet. This is just a taste of the work to be done.
- The TTC is also working on a major revision of the TTC Bylaws, which should be reviewed, approved, and recommended to the Lodge in the very near future.

The Division Leadership Conference took place on March 16<sup>th</sup> at the Alexandria Scottish Rite. This was a great one, chock full of news and information. Thank you to those that attended. Please consider attending this event in the future even if you are not an officer. It is a great opportunity to meet most of your Grand Line officers!!

We placed an order for new Lodge pins and minted our very first Lodge coin. Please come to Lodge so you can get your pin. We should have them on hand by the April Stated.

I am still on my quest to make contact with every brother on our rolls. I truly enjoy speaking to our veterans and hear the stories of Elmer Timberman Lodge of old. I do want to share some statistics with you. Of our 175 members: 50 Live outside of the State of VA; 45 Live in VA but well out of commuting distance of the Lodge; 9 Live in the vicinity of Lodge, but no longer drive at night or cannot get around; which leaves 64 Remaining that can regularly come to Lodge. We need more Masons!!! I am pleased to say that we have several prospects and I expect a few petitions in the coming weeks. Let's get ready to confer some degrees!

From our District Blood Coordinator, Alvaro Torrico, "Please join us at our District Blood Drive on Saturday, April 6, 8am to 1pm over at ACG (1 S. George Mason Drive, Arlington VA), Concord Lodge will be handling the canteen. Together we can work towards receiving the Jonas Seymour Levy Award for your lodge. You can save up to 3 lives with 1 blood donation. Go to [redcrossblood.org](http://redcrossblood.org) and use sponsor code: "BREAKFAST" to schedule an appointment. Walk-ins are welcomed. Please try to attend, if not to donate blood then for some brotherly bonding over some pancakes. Currently, the Red Cross is asking us to meet their requirement of blood units collected at each of our drives, which is 23-26 depending on the location and time of year. In the past, we have been able to meet their requirements, but we as a new District I have no doubt can achieve more and stun the Red Cross by collecting 30-40 units per drive (which has been done before). My goal this year, is to collect no less than 30 units per drive. Easy if we work together as a District. In our new district, we have 9 lodges and I figure that if each lodge can simply have

2 or 3 representatives donate blood at each drive, we can easily collect 18-27 units no problem. What do I mean by “representatives”, have anyone you know come to donate blood and have them drop your lodge's name when signing in and your lodge will receive credit towards the Jonas Seymour Levy Award.” Please support this worthwhile initiative, or at least spread the word and your friends to donate, mason or non-mason. I ask that every lodge get at least two guys to sign up to donate. I have always wanted to know more about our uniform, the apron, and its various shapes, designs, and accoutrements. I am pleased to announce that WBro. Greg McCarney of Masonic Hall in Richmond will be with us at our June Stated to give a presentation on Masonic aprons from around the world. I have been told this is a fantastic presentation, so your time will not be wasted. He worked for Macoy's for some time. Here is his biography, “Worshipful McCarney was raised a Master Mason in Midlothian Lodge No. 211 in Midlothian, Virginia in 2008. He served as Worshipful Master in 2012 and 2014 and continues to serve as a District Education Officer.
