

## **Interim General Minister of Virginia Council of Churches Appointed**

From the Virginia Council of Churches:

The Reverend Mary Anne Glover has

been called as the Interim General Minister of the Virginia Council of Churches. Reverend Glover was the first African-American woman to be installed in the office of Regional Minister in the Chris-



tian Church (Disciples of Christ). She served as Transitional Regional Minister of the Northeastern Region beginning September, 2008 and was installed as Regional Minister in 2012. She previously served nine years as Associate Regional Pastor in the Christian Church in Ohio.

Additionally, Reverend Glover's prior ministerial service included pastorates of congregations in Indianapolis, Minneapolis, and Louisville.

Reverend Glover holds a B.S. degree from East Carolina University and an M. Div. from Lexington Theological Seminary. She was the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) representative to the Ecumenical Institute in Bossey, Switzerland in 1991 and interned at the U.S. Office World Council of Churches in 1990. She has also undertaken studies in Clinical Pastoral Education supervision. During her 2003 sabbatical, Reverend Glover studied at the Harvard Divinity School as a Merrill Fellow.

She has been engaged in many areas of ecumenical ministries and Disciples church life, including senior leadership positions with the Black Ministers Fellowship, the Common Global Ministries Board, the Council on Christian Unity, the Church Women Staff Fellowship, the United Church of Christ Executive Council (representing the Christian Church, Disciples of Christ), the Church Women United National Board, and the Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches Beyond Racism Together Committee.

## **Healing Communities -Stations of Hope Training**

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." -Luke 4:18-19 (NIV)

The Social Justice Commission of BGCVA has been collaborating with local, state and national organizations to fight against mass incarceration. Mass incarceration has had its greatest negative impact on the poor, people of color, and particularly black males since these groups are often targeted, arrested and jailed at a much higher rate and at a much younger age than other groups. There are many issues that have led to a disproportionate number of African Americans being tracked into the "school to prison" pipeline. As a result we now how record numbers of incarcerated persons of all ages.

In the wake of this reality, we advocate for changes to the law that in effect are unjust for many. We also push for changes in the laws, legal system, its courts and local, state and national representatives that support disproportionate sentencing, low felony thresholds and other practices that feed mass incarceration.

The reality is, every time a man, woman, boy or girl is locked up their families are often hurt and sometimes devastated. It's not only the presence, but loss of income, relationships and even hope. For some there is shame and embarrassment and the loss of a residence, vehicle and debt incurred leading up to the incarceration. Another reality stemming from mass incarceration is that most of the incarcerated will be released at some point which creates many challenges for the households they return too (if that is even possible) and a challenge for the community at large. As you may be aware, there are some programs available to assist those coming of incarceration, but not enough. This is especially so in small towns and rural areas. There are even fewer services to assist the families, especially children, of the incarcerated while they are imprisoned.

There are many formerly incarcerated, recently released, about to be incarcerated and suffering mothers, fathers, grandparents, brothers, sisters, aunts, unless and friends in our churches and their surrounding communities. Many may be suffering in silence and thinking they are alone and some may be losing hope.

The Good News is that BGCVA has a presence in virtually every corner of the Commonwealth of Virginia and we are hoping many of our churches will become "Stations of Hope" for individuals and families impacted by incarceration. Since 2016, we have been sharing information at BGCVA conferences on the "Healing Communities - Stations of Hope" church-based model for serving returning citizens (healingcommunitiesusa.com).

On January 20, 2018 we held our first "Stations of Hope" Training in Williamsburg at the Holiday Inn - Gateway. Facilitator: Rev. Dr. J. Elisha Burke "Understanding the Impacts of Incarceration on Health" and Guest Facilitator: Rev. Dr. Harold Dean "Doc" Trulear, Director of the Healing Communities Prison Ministry and Prisoner Reentry Project of the Philadelphia Leadership Foundation & Associate Professor of Applied Theology at Howard University School of Divinity



This was a learning opportunity for new and existing ex-offender ministries to learn the Healing Communities model of faith-b based re-entry ministry. The model is focused on building relationships of healing, redemption and reconciliation in families and communities impacted by crime and mass incarceration.

Healing Communities is a framework for a distinct form of ministry for men and women returning from or at risk of incarceration, their families and the larger com-

munity. Healing Communities challenges congregations to become Stations of Hope for those persons affected by criminal justice system.



This session trained clergy, other church leaders and members to:

- Walk with the returning citizens (connect returning citizens to resources that will help set attainable
- Help them connect with their faith (provide spiritual support)
- Open their hearts to them (foster positive relationships)
- Embrace them (extend open and affirming fellowship)



- Provide understanding (collaboration with family and friends to rebuild relationships)
- Advocate for political change on a local, state, and federal level

We are thankful for the individuals representing \_\_\_ churches in attendance at this session. A follow-up session was held on April 7th at BGCVA. Participants received the BGCVA Re-entry and Aftercare Ministry Toolkit to information for next steps as they prayerful move forward with this ministry.

Associations and churches are encouraged to host Stations of Hope training for persons interested in starting a Reentry ministry or adding it to an existing prison outreach ministry.

Congratulations to Rev. Dr. Patricia Gould-Champ and the Faith Community Baptist Church, Richmond, VA for being the first to offer a "Second Chance Sunday" as a part of this initiative. This was a blessed celebration with and for families and community members impacted by incarceration. I am also thankful to have been the guest preacher for that Sunday.

# **Youth and Young Adult Ministries Update**

Every new year signifies the ending of an era as well as the beginning of a new one. For the Youth and Young Adult Department here at the Baptist General Convention of Virginia, we have been overwhelmed by the kindness of God in this new calendar year.

In March, we kicked off with our Annual Youth Worker's Conference that was entitled "Tackling Taboo Topics." It was here, where over 100 leaders labored together to understand hard issues involving not only our young people but also our children; topics in which we tend to shy away from in our traditional religious settings.

In June, during our Annual Session we had about 30 youth to participate for the week, where we engaged in conversations about "Jesus & Justice." It was here where they actively discussed how it feels to be a young Christian in an age that is still overly saturated with racial, social, political and economic injustice. Also in that week, we provided moments for our young people to learn about their Black History at the Richmond African American Museum and created opportunities to give back through community service at the Children's Home of Virginia Baptists, Inc.

We have also supported back-to-school drives in our service area of Petersburg and from this point forward, each year we will choose a different city for our constituents to send resources for school supply drives across the state every August.

Our Youth Retreat which was held on the campus of Virginia Union University this July, brought together around 200 youth and leaders for two wonderful days filled with myriad of worship services, experiential learning opportunities as well as a closing King's Dominion Family Day at JoyFest 2018. This year we were blessed to be able to tag team with STREAM, which is a theological camp dedicated to teaching youth not only about biblical principles but also how to implement them in the community. Our youth will be partnering with this camp and others next July as well.



In September, we will be starting a Youth Retreat 2019 Campaign where are goal is to reach \$2,000, these funds will be added to our overall retreat budget to help provide more meaningful experiences for our children next year. We are indeed excited about what God has done and continues to do for this department but we still need your help. ## Men's Ministry @ 2018 Mid-Winter Ministries Session

The Men's Ministry gathered on Friday, February 16, 2018 for "Brothers Night" featuring Presentations and Dialogue with Steven Brown, Men's Ministry State President and special guest Ron Clark, MPP, Preventive Health & Health Services Coordinator / Virginia Department of Health Virginia Dept. of Health and Dr. J. Elisha Burke, Men's Ministry Director.

Mr. Clark emphasized that the health challenges of African American men can be lessened by adopting a healthy lifestyle and sticking with it. The discussion also included some of the men sharing their own challenges as well as testimonies to the benefit of regular doctor visits. Mr. Clark also shared information on how to establish healthy routines over the course of each day. Dr. Burke also reminded the men to include men's health information as a permanent focus of the local church men's ministry and plan accordingly. State Director, Steven Brown, a retired nurse, moderated the discussion and was instrumental to this lively, relevant discussion. He also challenged the men to go back to their churches and encourage the men to have similar talks in their men's ministry meetings and other gatherings.

On Saturday, February 16, 2018 the Men's Ministry gather for a Presentation and

Dr. Coleman's addressed the long-standing challenge of African American churches to attract and keep males actively engaged in the church. Those gathered reflected the fact they most of the males currently active in our churches are older males, with younger men notably absent. To add a young man's perspective, Dr. Coleman's co-presenter was his son Rev. James Eric Coleman who is currently a student at Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond.



It was a blessing to gather in Richmond for our Annual Session, and to be blessed by the Lord with a good feeling that the Lord is renewing our Convention and that the future is looking GREAT! Congratulations to Dr. Gregory Howard, our President and may God's blessings be his as he leads us to higher grounds. Also, we pray for the best for Dr. Leo Whitaker, our new Executive Minister, as we have the highest of hope for our years to come under his administration.

To all of our BGC family, please accept our sincere gratitude for your continued support to the Baptist General Convention Foundation since 1995 and during our dormant years (2010-2018). Prior to the Annual Session, the BGC leadership endorsed the restart of the Foundation as a financial arm of the Convention. However, we are returning with a "New Vision" where our funds will create a legacy that will "Give and Live" as we build the Principle and utilize the Interest only. At our Annual Session, we were able to raise over \$10,200 to put into this fund. However, we need to raise \$14,800 to open the account at \$25,000 by the Fall Session. Also, with the matching \$25,000 we will be able to start our Foundation with \$50,000 at our Fall Session (November 8, 2018 at Fifth Baptist Church, Richmond, VA).

It would be a blessed goal for our Convention to rebuild an even stronger Foundation providing scholarships, grants for special ministries, and even a convention center on the shared properties of the Children's Home of Virginia---It is our prayer that God will bless us with a vision for the great things He has in store for us (Jer. 29:11).

## BGCVA Headquarters Is Blessed By In-Kind Services

school and in college from FBC. The students used the riding lawn mower, weed eater, electrical hedge trimmer and traditional garden tools to beautify our



grounds. A wild urban forest was transformed into a shining star of horticultural splendor.

In additional, many thanks to our ministry partner at FBC Centralia for graciously hosting our Church Finance and Tax Compliance Conference in January. BGCVA was welcomed to the church for this event. In addition, FBC provided a catered lunch at no cost to BGCVA.

 Earlier this year, the Gethsemane Baptist Church in Newport News and Dr. Dwight Riddick welcomed BGCVA Mid-Winter Ministries Session participants. generosity was expressed in a two-day event that created space for the Women Ministry, Men's Ministry, Moderator's Ministry and officers of the BGCVA. Vendors were granted space in the foyer to display and market their goods. Ministry partners were able to converse with attendees. Lunch was catered by First Baptist Church East End "Lighthouse Catering" of Newport News. This 5-Star ministry unfolded on the hinges of hospitality and grace. We thank Dr. Riddick and President Gregory Howard for their combined in-kind services and witness.

We invite your church and association to join those who have blessed the work of our Convention in this new ministry approach. Opportunities abound for in-kind gifts to BGCVA for other churches to participate. We currently need painters and both carpet and tile installers for the multipurpose and conference rooms as well as our main restrooms.

# 2018 Voter Registration and EVERY VOTE MATTERS

Steps to take immediately:

➤ Go to <a href="https://www.virginiaRegister2Vote.org">www.virginiaRegister2Vote.org</a> and check YOUR voter registration status. Click: Register To Vote on the State Board of Elections portal to check your status, if you are not ACTIVE, you can register online and your registration will immediately (no paperwork needed)

On www.VirginiaRegister2Vote.org you can:

- ➤ Check on the status of your voter registration to make sure you are listed as ACTIVE.
- ➤ If you are listed as INACTIVE but your info is correct, you can find contact info for your local Registrar's office.
- ➤ You can actually register to vote directly with the State Board of Elections (no paper needed and information is immediately sent to State Board of Elections.
- ➤ You can get an Absentee Ballot mailed to you from your local Registrar's office.
- You can officially change your address if you have moved (you can also use www.VirginiaRegister2Vote.org if you move in the future).
- ➤ Returning Citizens (formally called ex-Felons) can confidentially check to see if their Voting Rights have been restored yet.
- ➤ If their Voting Rights have already been restored, Returning Citizens can immediately register to vote online.
- ➤ If their Voting Rights have not been restored, they can confidentially begin the process to get their Voting Rights restored.

## **BGC Scholars Program**

The Baptist General Convention of Virginia (BGCVA) is proud to partner with Virginia Union University (VUU) in assisting our youth [with the help of our associations and churches] with a special scholarship opportunity. Students actively participating in their church with a 3.0 or better GPA are eligible to enroll in the program. Upon acceptance, BGC Scholars will receive a quarterly enrichment sponsored by BGCVA for their academic and personal development. VUU has pledged to match all BGCVA funds, up to \$3000 per BGC Scholar to cover financial gaps. A financial "gap" is the amount remaining after all of a students' financial aid and other scholarships have been applied to their account.
