Project Updates and Needed Donations

AIS Eurasian watermilfoil (EWM) and curlyleaf pondweed (CLP)

- The BLCA is on track to getting our lakes' AIS treated this year. As soon as the ice comes off the CLP survey, permitting, treatment delineation and application will take place. We will not be treating EWM this year. Last year, everything the DNR permitted treating was either hand pulled or sprayed. All four lakes will be surveyed in late summer for EWM. What is found then will be the basis for the 2017 EWM treatment plan.
- We are still planning on paying for signage to be placed at each public landing to inform the public that EWM exists in Rush Lake and where it is probably located.
- We are planning to place yellow warning buoys in Rush Lake marking the areas
 we think there still is EWM and it remains established in areas we are not permitted to treat. We want to discourage boating in these areas as EWM can
 spread from fragments cut off by propellers.
- We intend to purchase a buoy, to be placed on the Rush side of the Rush/Briggs channel, advising boaters to reverse their props before entering Briggs to prevent the spread of EWM beyond Rush
- AIS control is expensive. It is paid for with grants and donations. The grants have been from the DNR whose resources are shrinking and so are the grants. More grants are being requested making the amount of each grant less. Many residents make generous donations but the annual total has not been equal to the expense. If this keeps up, the amount of AIS the BLCA can control will shrink, making it likely infested areas will get bigger and AIS will spread to new areas. So far this year, the BLCA has received \$4,770 of the more than \$10,000 the AIS control is expected to cost. **Please donate for these worthy projects**.

July 2nd Fireworks Display

• We are on track for a fireworks display on Briggs Lake, Saturday, July 2, 2016. The BLCA facilitates the volunteers who set it up and collects the donations that finance the show. The BLCA signs a contract with a pyrotechnic company in the amount of the donations collected by June 1st. Donations received after that will go toward the 2017 display. Last year's display cost \$7,000 and so far \$1,448 has been donated. Donations determine the quality and duration of the display.

We have sent in the paperwork for permit(s) for controlling AIS weeds. Weed management is also on the agenda for the summer. The bad news is that the cost will run between \$13,000 and \$16,000 and so far donations haven't matched that outflow, so we will have to dip into our reserves to cover it.

We are looking forward to serving the needs of the lake community with you this year!

GENTLE FOOTPRINTS by the Healthy Lakes Committee

One goal of the Healthy Lakes Committee is to continue financial and technical assistance for property owners wanting to establish conservation projects such as buffer strips, runoff prevention and rain gardens. This includes developing a "run off remediation program" in 2016. Funds are available from DNR Sherburne County Soil and Water and the Briggs Lake Chain Association.



The Gentle Footprints committee has been formed to replace the Ground Truth committee. This program is being developed to continue our association's support for home owners who launch projects to control run off with house gutters and down spouts, rain gardens, dry wells, shoreline buffers, etc.

We will finalize a resource packet for participants and recruit volunteers to 'walk and talk' with owners at their property to evaluate, propose and support their efforts from the road to the lake. We hope to utilize past ground truthing trained members for this project. More information will be forthcoming as we proceed. Project updates and your input are reviewed at the monthly Healthy Lakes Committee meetings.
