PERMANENT MASS SCHEDULE CHANGES TO COME

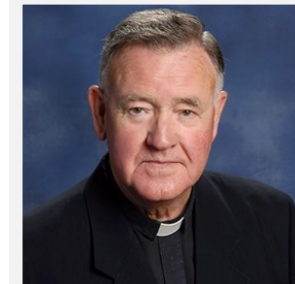
As has been announced **STARTING WITH THE WEEKEND OF AUGUST 31/SEPTEMBER 1**, a new Mass time schedule will be adopted for the Parish. This **NEW** schedule will be as follows:

- The 9:00 am Saturday morning Spanish Mass will be cancelled;
- **A regular daily Mass will be celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:00 am. This Mass will not fulfill your Sunday obligation however;**
- The 5:30 pm Saturday Vigil Mass will remain the same and in English;
- **The 8:15 am Sunday morning Mass will be moved to 8:30 am and will be prayed in Spanish;**
- The 11:00 am Sunday morning Mass will remain the same and prayed in English.

It is with sadness that we must announce the passing of Father Raymond Heffernan last Sunday evening. **Father Raymond Heffernan**, born Dec. 31, 1930, in Belfast, Ireland, was ordained June 16, 1957, by Bishop Denis Moynihan, at Hollows College, Dublin. He served as pastor of St.

Augustine Parish in Oak Harbor (1970-78), Holy Cross Parish in Tacoma (1978-85), St. Mary Star of the Sea Parish in Port Townsend (1985-2002), and of St. Francis Parish in Friday Harbor and its stations (2009-11; he was also priest administrator of St. Francis from 2003-09). He also served at St. Paul Parish in Seattle (1957-62), St. Philomena Parish in Des Moines (1967-70) and St. Alphonso Parish in Seattle (1970). While at St. Mary's Father Heffernan faithfully continued our faith traditions placing a particular emphasis upon the religious education of our children. He actively encouraged participation in and greater service to our parish and was noted as well for his fiscal responsibility. He semi-retired in 2002 however the Lord had further work for him to accomplish. He was given several other assignments in our Pacific North-west area and most recently he was a resident at St. Pius X Parish in Mountlake Terrace until his death. He will be fondly remembered by all who knew him and we were particularly honored to host his funeral on Friday, August 2. May Our Gracious Lord grant him eternal rest and may perpetual light shine upon him. Please remember him generously in your prayers.

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Name of the Lord is Holy

2146 The second commandment forbids the abuse of God's name, i.e., every improper use of the names of God, Jesus Christ, but also of the Virgin Mary and all the saints.

2147 Promises made to others in God's name engage the divine honor, fidelity, truthfulness, and authority. They must be respected in justice. To be unfaithful to them is to misuse God's name and in some way to make God out to be a liar.

2148 Blasphemy is directly opposed to the second commandment. It consists in uttering against God - inwardly or outwardly - words of hatred, reproach, or defiance; in speaking ill of God; in failing in respect toward him in one's speech; in misusing God's name. St. James condemns those "who blaspheme that honorable name [of Jesus] by which you are called." The prohibition of blasphemy extends to language against Christ's Church, the saints, and sacred things. It is also blasphemous to make use of God's name to cover up criminal practices, to reduce peoples to servitude, to torture persons or put them to death. The misuse of God's name to commit a crime can provoke others to repudiate religion.

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATOLICA

El Nombre del Señor es santo

2146 El segundo mandamiento prohíbe abusar del nombre de Dios, es decir, todo uso inconveniente del nombre de Dios, de Jesucristo, de la Virgen María y de todos los santos.

2147 Las promesas hechas a otro en nombre de Dios comprometen el honor, la fidelidad, la veracidad y la autoridad divinas. Deben ser respetadas en justicia. Ser infiel a ellas es abusar del nombre de Dios y, en cierta manera, hacer de Dios un mentiroso (cf 1 Jn 1, 10).

2148 La blasfemia se opone directamente al segundo mandamiento. Consiste en proferir contra Dios —interior o exteriormente— palabras de odio, de reproche, de desafío; en injuriar a Dios, faltarle al respeto en las expresiones, en abusar del nombre de Dios. Santiago reprueba a "los que blasfeman el hermoso Nombre (de Jesús) que ha sido invocado sobre ellos" (St 2, 7). La prohibición de la blasfemia se extiende a las palabras contra la Iglesia de Cristo, los santos y las cosas sagradas. Es también blasfemo recurrir al nombre de Dios para justificar prácticas criminales, reducir pueblos a servidumbre, torturar o dar muerte. El abuso del nombre de Dios para cometer un crimen provoca el rechazo de la religión.
